Greetings! I would like to provide you with an update since assuming an additional assignment as the Associate Vocation Director for our archdiocese. So far, things have been great. I can already tell this will be a very exciting and fruitful ministry

and I am very humbled to have a role in fostering vocations for the priesthood and religious life. In light of this additional ministry, I had to adjust my schedule a bit. Here is what a typical week for me will look like:

Monday – My day off

Tuesday – Mass at St. James and then available in the office. **Wednesday** – Mass at St. James and then available in the office. **Thursday** – School Mass, then I will head to the Vocation Office. **Friday** – I will be in the Vocation Office.

Saturday and Sunday – I will typically be available for the celebration of Sunday Eucharist at St. James.

Some of my additional roles in the Vocation Office will be to make the official fall visits to our seminarians who are studying throughout the United States and in Rome, Italy. These visits will take place during the weekday. I will also visit, when available, our local grade schools and high schools in the archdiocese.

*NEW At the end of July, with the permission and blessing from Archbishop Kurtz, I was appointed as the Chaplain and Ex-Officio Board Member of Dismas Charites, INC. This opportunity will allow me to have a spiritual and religious presence locally and nationally, as I assist Dismas Charities, INC in *Healing the Human Spirit*. This has been their motto since 1964, when founded by Fr. William Diersen, a priest of the Archdiocese of Louisville. At this time, I do not feel that this appointment will take me away from my responsibilities at the parish or the Vocation Office.
