Copied from the United States Council of Catholic Bishops Formation of Conscience:

21. Aided by the virtue of prudence in the exercise of well-formed consciences, Catholics are called to make practical judgments regarding good and evil choices in the political arena.

22. There are some things we must never do, as individuals or as a society because they are always incompatible with love of God and neighbor. Such actions are so deeply flawed that they are always opposed to the authentic good of persons. These are called "intrinsically evil" actions. They must always be rejected and opposed and must never be supported or condoned. A prime example is the intentional taking of innocent human life as in abortion and euthanasia. . . A legal system that violates the basic right to life on grounds of choice is fundamentally flawed.

23. Similarly human cloning, destructive research on human embryos, and other acts that directly violate the sanctity and dignity of human life are also intrinsically evil. . . Other direct assaults such as racism, genocide, torture, and the targeting of non- combatants in acts of terror or war can
