In those days a decree went out from Caesar Augustus that all the world should be registered. And Joseph also went up from Galilee, from the town of



Nazareth, to Judea, to the city of David, which is called Bethlehem, because he was of the house and lineage of David, to be registered with Mary, his betrothed, who was with child. Luke. 2: 1-3-4-5

They were offered lodging in a manger located in a cave. The dye was cast. Soon, an unimaginable gift of love would be given to humanity by God the Father.
