REFLECTION. On New Year's Day, the octave (8th day) of Christmas, the Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Holy Mother of God. This title was given to Mary at the Council of Ephesus in 431 A.D. The Council taught the humanity and divinity of Jesus could not be separated, that they exist in one person. Therefore, we can rightly give to Mary her most honored title; the Mother of God. Mothers bring new life, a great gift from God, into the world. The civilization in which we live today can rightly be described as neo-pagan. It is the duty of today's Christians, and all people of good will, as it was for the early Christians, to labor in the Lord's vineyard. All Christian's are called to effect a conversion to love in the modern world. Respecting life from womb to tomb would be a good starting point.
