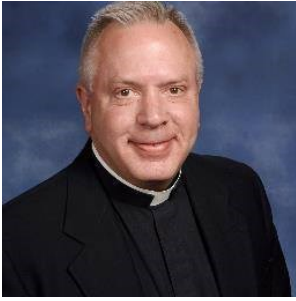

Dear Parishioners:

It is difficult to believe another Fiscal Year and school year is almost behind us. As they often do in the life of a church, the days and months pass quickly filled many activities and ministries.

This has certainly been the case in our parish this year and I wanted to take some time to reflect on that with you a bit.

We have celebrated many things in our parish and school this year. Obviously, I cannot name them all, but some of the highlights are below:

Partnership with the Dominican Sisters – The addition of the sisters to our parish community has strengthened us in our faith in many ways.

Introduction Marriage Date Night and Widowed Friends Group – We continue to identify groups within our faith community that we can support and minister to in a way that assists them in living their Catholic faith.

Family Faith Formation – we have always formed our children in faith, but are now focusing on our families through this program rooted in the Dominican tradition.

Social Service – St. Vincent de Paul and Room in the Inn continue to minister to a large number of individuals and families in our community who are in need. *Some impressive numbers from this past year include 154 people served by Room In the Inn over a 12 week period – nearly 100 volunteers made this happen!*

Saint James Catholic School continues to excel Academically and we have shared many of those successes with you throughout the year; however, it is important for you to know that we continue to strengthen our curriculum to meet the needs of all and by focusing this past year on the frameworks of teaching. We have also introduced a tutoring program that has had a very positive influence on our school community. Our sports teams continue to excel offering our students the opportunity to understand the that a well-rounded Christian life includes team dynamics and an emphasis on health. What I continue to be most impressed with is the commitment of our teachers and administrators to educate our children to be true Disciples who study, serve and pray.

Parish Discernment Process – Although not complete, I think this process has been good for us as a parish and I look forward to the outcomes that parishioners will have helped us identify during the listening sessions.

The end of the Fiscal Year and school calendar is a natural ending and beginning for us as we close out the year and look forward to what is to come. For us that means wishing Father Shayne farewell as he prepares to leave us for his new role at Saint Raphael. I hope you will make plans to join us as we say goodbye and wish him well on **Saturday, June 17 after the 5 p.m. Mass** in Batcheldor Hall. As things wind down a bit over the summer, I will be looking forward to the start of another great Fiscal Year and school year beginning in July and August respectfully.

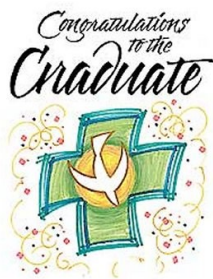

How does a parish make a disciple? If we believe the Rite of Christian Initiation
of Adults is all about making disciples, rather than a sole focus on teaching
Catholic doctrine in "Conference Room 102 in the Parish Center on Tuesday
nights from 7:00 to 9:00 p.m.," how do we re-shape our initiation processes so
that making intentional disciples is the goal and the outcome?

Dr. Jerry Galipeau is Vice President and Chief Publishing Officer for the J.S. Paluch Company
and its music and liturgy division, World Library Publications, in Franklin Park, Illinois. Before
coming to WLP, he served for fifteen years as Director of Liturgy and Music at parishes in Florida
and Illinois. He has presented keynotes and workshops throughout the United States and Canada
on the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, liturgical spirituality, ritual music, evangelization and
adult spiritual formation. Past chair of the Board of Directors of the North American Forum on the
Catechumenate, Jerry was a frequent team member for Forum's institutes. A popular parish
mission presenter and retreat leader, he earned the Doctor of Ministry with a concentration in
liturgical studies from Catholic Theological Union at Chicago in 1999.

Jerry's articles have appeared in Catechumenate, Liturgical Singer, Pastoral Music, Today's Parish,
Rite, and Church magazines, as well as Sourcebook for Sundays and Seasons. Jerry's books are
published by World Library Publications, including *Prayer Services for Parish Life*, *Apprenticed to
Christ: Activities for Practicing the Catholic Way of Life*, and his latest book *You Have Put on Christ:
Cultivating a Baptismal Spirituality*.
