Reflection. In a new book *The Pope and the President*, author Paul Kengor has credited Pope St. John II and President Ronald Reagan as being stalwarts in their defense of innocent human life. He notes how the future Pope and Saint escaped death during his long life. In his youth he was hit by a vehicle, his life was certainly at risk when the Nazis invaded Poland, and in 1981 after assuming the Papacy, he nearly died from an assassin's bullet.

According to the author of the book, the future Popes' life was at risk even before he was born. The doctor told his mother Emilia Wojtyla, "You have to have an abortion." The doctor told Emilia because of the pregnancy her life was in danger, and she should abort. Emilia proved the doctor wrong. She gave birth to a child described by her as "strong as an ox." His mother predicted Karol Jozef Wojtyla would be a great man someday. Oh, how right she was; one can only imagine the great void that would exist in the Church and world today if Emilia had acted upon the advice of her doctor.
