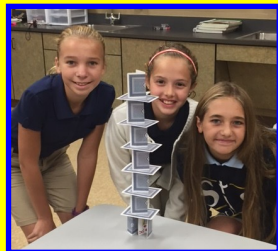

Ms. McGuffin's sixth grade class spends time each week in a classroom STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Math) challenge which encourages students to problem solve as a team in an effort to finish ahead of the other teams. The class has competed in two challenges recently, one of which tested their skills at building a house of cards higher than their classmates – there were several towers over 2 feet tall. The other challenged them to build the longest paper chain out of only two pieces of construction paper. With these classroom activities, Ms. McGuffin continues to challenge her students to think "outside the box" and consider unconventional ways to complete a task.

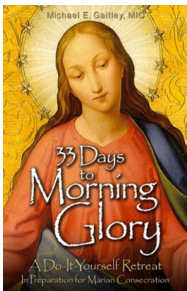
