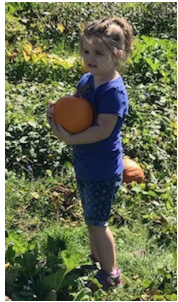

**REFLECTION.** St. Mother Teresa also said, "By abortion the mother does not learn to love, but takes the life even of her own child to solve her problems...Jesus gave even His life to love us. So the mother...should be helped to love, that is, to give until it hurts...to respect the life of her child." Since St. Mother Teresa's speech in Washington DC there have been many acts of violence by terrorists and misguided citizens in our nation. The most recent attack occurred Oct 1, 2017 in Las Vegas, Nevada. In that episode of violence 50 persons lost their lives, and over 500 were injured. However, only changing the law represents a partial healing of the real quandary of evil facing the nation we love and call home.
