ADVENT

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Advent is upon us! However, as a convert to Catholicism, I must admit that I still struggle with Advent. I am strongly inclined to throw up the tree the day after Thanksgiving just like my momma and I always did when I was a kid. Of course, my twin brother Cody was nowhere to be found...how convenient! I will admit, it's hard not to get into the "Christmas spirit" with Walmart having the Christmas decorations out since about June.

Nonetheless, in my 8 years as a Catholic, there has always been, deep within my heart of hearts, a growing desire to understand more fully and enter into more wholeheartedly the season of Advent. I've come to realize there are many ways to do that, but this year I want to focus on a question my spiritual director once asked me in seminary: What does salvation mean to you? At first glance, the obvious answer is "Heaven!" But, there is so much more depth to that question than immediately meets the eye.

Two thousand years ago, a little baby boy entered this dark world. At that time, the people of Israel had heard nothing but deafening silence from God since the prophet Malachi spoke nearly 400 years before that. That silence ended with the whimper of a baby. Nobody knew it then, but that whimper would swell into a deafening cry from the Cross 33 years later: "My God, my God, why have You forsaken Me?" (Matthew 27:46).

This Advent, as we forge ahead through the growing darkness of fall and make our way toward the gentle whimper of that baby boy on Christmas Day, we should be asking ourselves what His birth back then means for us today. How His cry on Calvary still reverberates through the centuries to this very moment. Indeed, Heaven is our ultimate goal and our eternal salvation, but what about 2017 in Elizabethtown, Kentucky. Where is our salvation in this dark valley of tears?

A blessed Advent to you all. May His salvation reign in our hearts here and now, always and everywhere.
