In celebration of the Solemnity of All Saints on November 1, the seventh-grade class at Saint James Catholic School presented a Living Wax Museum. On that day, all classes within the school will be visiting the museum to learn about the more than 40 saints represented including Saint Luke, Saint Joan of Arc, Saint Francis of Assisi and many more. As individuals visited

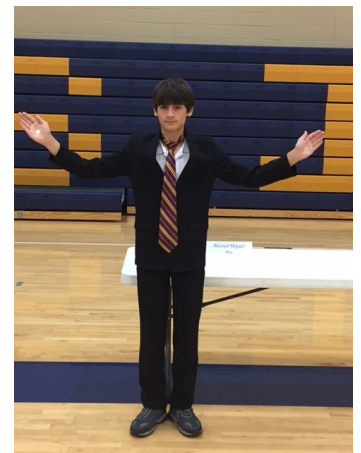
the different saints, they were encouraged to push a button located on the student or on an object in their possession. With a push of the button, the student told a brief story about the life of the saint they were portraying.

"Saints are very important to the tradition of the Catholic Church," says Sister Marie Hannah, O.P. Principal of Saint James Catholic School. "It is important for us to teach our students about the lives of the saints in an effort to help them understand what it means to be a disciple of Christ and that holiness is possible for everyone."



Annually, the middle school students at Saint James Catholic School participate in the Kentucky Youth Assembly (KYA) process in school and optionally at the general assembly in Louisville. Over the past few weeks, all middle school students learned about the legislative process, including how to research ideas, create and present bills, and form thoughtful

speeches in argument or support of bills. They presented their bills in the classroom and then further presented their bills in the gym to all middle school students. Five bills from 7th and 8th and three bills from 6th grade have been chosen to go to the assembly on November 30th. Additionally, Saint James will have 96 students and two delegates at the assembly-- Nate Jarboe running for candidate and Jackson Clark as presiding officer.

REFLECTION. It is frequently asserted that contraception, if made safe and available to all, is the most effective remedy against abortion. The Catholic Church is then accused of actually promoting abortion, because she obstinately continues to teach the moral unlawfulness of contraception. When looked at carefully, this objection is clearly unfounded. It may be that many people use contraception with a view to excluding the subsequent temptation of abortion. But the negative values inherent in the 'contraceptive mentality,' which is very different from responsible parenthood lived in respect for the full truth of the conjugal act, are such that they in fact strengthen this temptation when an unwanted life is conceived. Indeed, the pro-abortion culture is especially strong precisely where the Church's teaching on contraception is rejected.

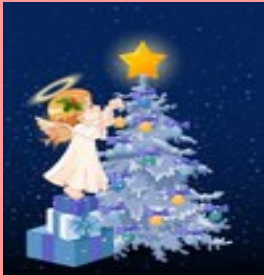

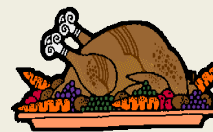
