One of my clearest memories of Advent in my Catholic grade school is walking past the beautiful display which hung on my sixth grade teacher's door. Each morning as I passed into the classroom I would read the words that have become a favorite Advent prayer:





**USCCB Respect Life Liturgy Guide 2010** 

**REFLECTION.** The new image of Our Lady of Guadalupe near the baptismal font in the back of Saint James Church, represents beauty beyond description. There are many symbols incorporated in the miraculous portrait of Our Lady. However, here, we will concentrate on the black girdle or bow tied around her waist. The black girdle or bow around the waist, representing fertility and new life was customarily worn by Aztec mothers during pregnancy. When the explorers entered into the country now known as Mexico, they discovered human sacrifices, including one out of five children, were being offered by pagan priests to pagan gods. In the image of Our Lady of Guadalupe our Blessed Mother was pregnant and wore a black girdle or bow around her waist, as a sign of new life and virginity. The image communicated to the Aztec people the Virgin Mother would give birth to God the Son, and her Son would be with them during their trials and tribulations. Because of this resplendent miracle human sacrifices were discontinued, and seven to eight million Aztec people were converted to the Catholic Faith.

Prayer. Heavenly Father, we thank you for the gift of life. We pray all people of good will; will work and pray for an end to human sacrifices in our day. May all peoples of Your creation respect and support, in generosity and law, all innocent human life, born and unborn.


