God created man in His own image, in the image of God He created him; male and female He created them. God blessed them; and God said to them, "Be fruitful and multiple, and fill the earth, and subdue it.... **Genesis 1:27-28**



REFLECTION. It is significant that in His reply to the Pharisees, in which He appealed to the "beginning," Christ indicated first of all the creation of man by referring to **Genesis 1:27**; "The Creator from the beginning created them male and female." Only afterward did he quote the text of **Gn 2:24** -*That is why a man leaves his father and mother and clings to his wife and the two of them become one flesh.* The words which directly describe the unity and indissolubility of marriage are found in the immediate context of the second account of creation. Its characteristic feature is the separate creation of woman (cf. **Gn 2:7 21-22** – **So the Lord God cast a deep sleep on the man, and while he was asleep, He took out one of His ribs and closed up its place with flesh. The Lord God then built the rib He had taken from the man into a woman.**

The Bible calls the first human being "man" (*adam*) but from the moment of the creation of the woman, it begins to call him "man" (*ish*) in relation to *ishshah* ("woman," because she was taken from man - *ish*). It is also significant that in referring to **Gn 2-24** , Christ not only linked the "beginning" with the mystery of creation, but also led us, one might say, to the limit of man's primitive innocence and of original sin. Genesis places the second description of man's creation precisely in this context. There we read first of all: "**And the rib which the Lord God had taken from man He made her into a woman and bought her to the man; then the man said: "This is at last bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh; she shall be called woman, because she was taken out of man."** **Gn 2:22-23.** "Therefore a man leaves his father and his mother and cleaves to his wife, and they become one flesh. **Gn 2:24** "And the man and his wife were both unclad, and they were not ashamed." **Gn 2:25** -**Pope St. John Paul II, Original Unity of Men and Women, Theology of the Body, n32**

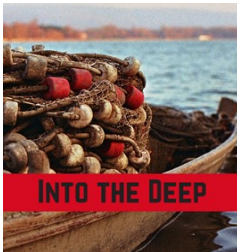
