**REFLECTION.** Pope John Paul II, in his weekly audiences between September 1979 and November 1984, were comprised of a catechesis on the bodily dimension of human personhood, sexuality, and marriage. When confronted with a fundamental question about the meaning of marriage and human sexuality Jesus appealed to 'the beginning' described in the opening Chapters of Genesis. John Paul II proposed to do the same.

The Holy Father had the incomprehensible gift to present these beautiful truths, given to us by Christ Jesus, in a manner and language that could be easily understood by Modern Man. 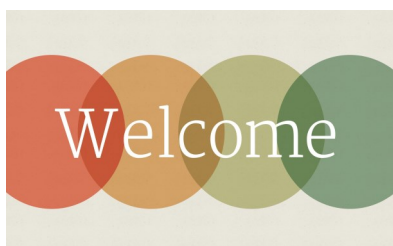

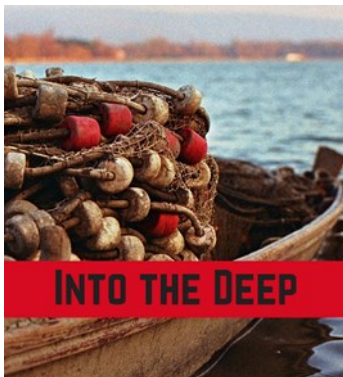
