

And I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between thy seed and her seed; they shall bruise thy head and you shall bruise him on the heel.

Genesis 3:15



According to chapter 19 of Matthew, when Christ referred to the "beginning," by this expression he did not indicate merely the state of original innocence as the lost horizon of human existence in human history. To the words which he uttered with his own lips, we have the right to attribute at the same time the whole eloquence of the mystery of redemption. Already in the Yawist texts of Genesis 2 and 3, we are witnesses of when man, male and female, after breaking the original covenant with the Creator, received the first promise of redemption in the words of the so called *Proto-gospel in Genesis 3:15 and began to live in the theological perspective of the redemption.

In the same way, therefore, historical man-both Christ's questioner at that time, of whom Matthew 19 speaks, and modern man-participates in this perspective. He participates not only in the history of human sinfulness, as a hereditary and at the same time personal and unique subject of this history; he also participates in the history of salvation, here, too, as its subject and cocreator. Therefore, he is not only closed, because of his sinfulness, with regard to original innocence, but is at the same time open to the mystery of redemption, which was accomplished in Christ and through Christ. Paul, the author of the Letter to the Romans, expresses this perspective of redemption in which historical man lives, when he writes: "We ourselves, who have the first fruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly as we wait for. . .the redemption of our bodies" (Rom 8:23). We cannot loose sight of this perspective as we follow the words of Christ, who, in his talk on the indissolubility of marriage, appealed to the "beginning." * Proto Gospel in Genesis 3:15 is prophetic nature. There will be a Redeemer in the future, one who will crush the head of the serpent (Satan). This fact was accomplished when the Virgin Mary gave birth to God's Son, Jesus.
