May the peace of the Lord be with you always!

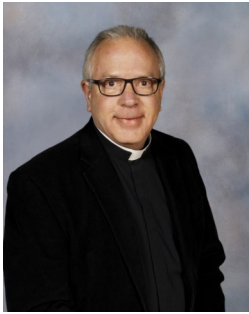

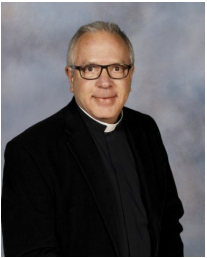

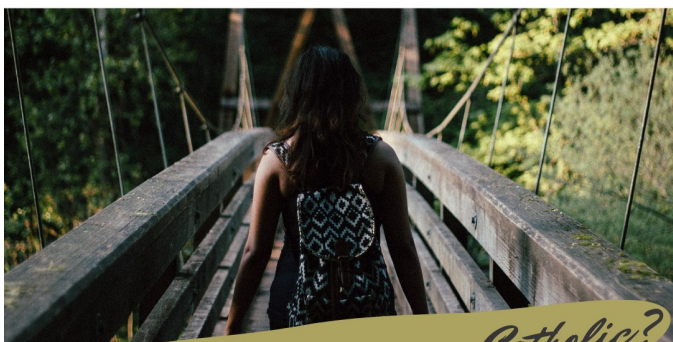
CRUSADE FOR CHILDREN
