New York Cardinal Timothy Dolan, Chairman of the U. S. Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) Committee on Pro-Life Activities, launched a nationwide effort on Thursday July 26, to pray that the next U. S. Supreme Court appointment “will move our nation closer to the day when every human being is protected in law and welcomed in life.”



“As soon as the Supreme Court Justice Anthony Kennedy announced his retirement, pro-abortion groups began lobbying the U.S. Senate to reject any nominee who will not promise to endorse Roe v Wade,” said Dolan. “While the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops does not support or oppose the confirmation of any presidential nominee, we can and should raise grave concerns about a confirmation process which is being grossly distorted by efforts to subject judicial nominees to a litmus test of support for Roe v Wade abortion decision.” Cardinal Dolan added, “We must pray.”

The USCCB had previously established a weekly Call to Prayer for Life, Marriage, and Religious Liberty. That Call to Prayer will be adapted to the nine-week, *from Friday, August 3, to Friday September 3, Novena for the Legal Protection of Human Life*. Along with the invitation to fast on Fridays during the Novena, the Bishops ask us to pray one Our Father, Hail Mary, and Glory Be, during the listed time period, for the novena’s intention.

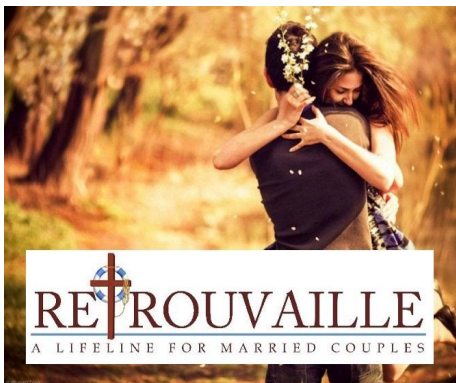

in Elizabethtown is in need of three volunteers to serve as its regular weekly Wednesday cooking team. One person would serve as head cook every Wednesday; the other two volunteers would assist. The head cook will plan in advance each Wednesday evening meal for about 40 to 70 people and work from approximately 1:30 to 5:30 p.m. every Wednesday. (Dinner is served from 5:30 to 6:30 p.m.) At least one of the volunteers must take food service training (free for Warm Blessings volunteers) through the Lincoln Trail District Health Department. Substitute cooks are also needed to fill in on an as-needed basis throughout the week.
