

REFLECTION. In a guest editorial for the Pennsylvania newspaper, *Delaware County Daily Times*, **Archbishop Charles Chaput** of Philadelphia writes: "Our flesh is not morally neutral. It's not simply 'wetware' or raw meat or molding clay for the will, but a revelation of God's glory demanding reverence and stewardship."

"This makes us a witnesses to a meaning and dignity of the human person that puts us at odds with the spirit of our age, an age perfectly captured by the 1973 Supreme Court Roe v Wade decision and its license to kill the unborn. The culture civil war triggered by *Roe* and its enshrinement of permissive abortion has never abated, and it continues full force (and rightly so) today. The stakes are high. Without a guaranteed right to life — a right that includes and recognizes the humanity of the unborn child — all other rights are legal fictions.
