REFLECTION. Peter Breen, the Vice President of the St. Thomas More Society reported, "Abortion proposals have been introduced in the Illinois General Assembly that is the most radical piece of legislation to have been proposed in any state to date."

According to the Society's analysis, the bills would enact into law the following:

- -Allow abortions for *any reason* throughout *all nine months of pregnancy.*
- -Eliminate restrictions where abortions may be performed.
- -Allow *non-physicians* to perform abortions, both surgical and medical.
- -Undermine and threaten institutional and individual rights of conscience.
- -Jeopardize any meaningful regulation of abortion clinics.
- -Require private health insurance policies to include coverage for all abortions, with no exceptions even for churches and other religious organizations.
- -Eliminate any requirements to investigate fetal or maternal deaths resulting from abortion.
- -Repeal laws prohibiting "kickbacks" for abortion referrals.
- -Repeal the Parental Notification Act of 1995.
- -Vice President Breen continued. "The citizens of Illinois must make their voices heard and stop this process."


