



# Prayer for an End to Infanticide

The U.S. Senate recently failed to pass the Born-Alive Abortion Survivors Protection Act—legislation that prohibits infanticide by ensuring that a child born alive following an attempted abortion would receive the same degree of care to preserve her or his life and health as would be given to any other child born alive at the same gestational age. **REFLECTION** – The four bills that were introduced by the Kentucky General Assembly's Pro-Life Caucus on Jan 10, 2019; **ALL passed the current legislative session.** Our Governor has indicated he will sign all the bills into law. The bills, SB 9, the "heartbeat bill"; SB 50, abortion pill reporting requirements, including the doctor must explain the Abortion Reversal Pill to the client; HB 5, no abortion for discriminatory reasons based on sex, race, color, national origin or disability, and HB 148, to end abortion if and when Roe v Wade is overturned by SCOTUS – all had bipartisan support. SB 227 to protect Born Alive Infants introduced on Feb, 15, 2019, did not make it to the finish line, as of yet. The Pro-Life Caucus is confident the bill will be passed before the end of the current General Assembly's session.

The Respect Life Committee sponsored the 8<sup>th</sup> grade students of St. James School on March 7<sup>th</sup> to the Rally for Life in Frankfort. The students were hosted by the Pro-Life Caucus Chairman Rep Tim Moore from Elizabethtown. The Governor, Matt Bevin, Rep Jim Duplessis, and many other Senators and Representatives addressed the Rally for Life.

Sixteen Respect Life Committee members attended the Celebration of Life Banquet on March 8, 2019 in Louisville. The speaker, Mr. Ryan Bomberger was conceived in rape but adopted in love. He grew up in a loving, multi-racial Christian family of 15. Mr. Bomberger was very confident the love for life will overcome the Culture of Death in America.
