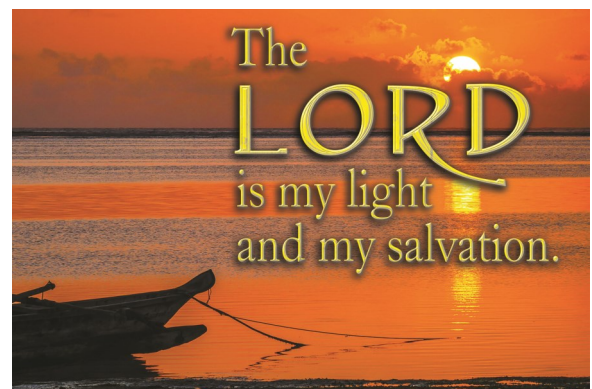

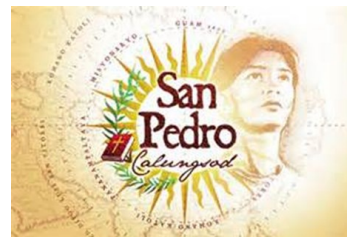
REFLECTION – On Feb 22, 2019 the Department of Health and Human Services announced that it finalized the "Protect Life Rule," regulations for the federal Title X family planning program.

The Rule requires clear financial and physical separation between Title X funded projects and programs or facilities where abortion is a method of family planning. Archbishop Joseph Naumann, Chairman of the U.S. Committee on Pro-Life Activities, issued the following statement commending HHS: "I applaud the Trump Administration for reaffirming that abortion is not family planning. Abortion ends the lives of families' most vulnerable members, as well as damaging the spiritual, mental and physical health of mothers. Although the USCCB continues to have strong objections to government promotion and funding of contraceptives, we have long supported enforcement of the abortion restrictions in Title X, and we are pleased to see that the Administrations has taken seriously its obligation to enforce those restrictions."*
