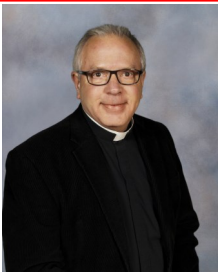
NOTICE USE OF INCENSE

We previously announced that going forward, we would be indicating the Masses in which there will expressly be no incense. A few parishioners expressed concerns about a lack of clarity and how this was subject to misunderstanding. Upon further reflection, we have decided to implement a new liturgy planning process internally in which we will decide in advance which Masses will have incense. Those Masses will have "Incense" marked beside them in the bulletin, and it will **only** be those Masses in which incense will be used. This will render the "No incense" indication previously adopted unnecessary, so we will be doing away with it.

Please note that we will continue the previously established practice of never using incense for the first Mass of any weekend or Holy Day of Obligation.

During Lent and Advent, however, the Sunday 8:00 AM Mass will always be incense free, as well.

ROE v WADE effectively rendered the definition of human personhood flexible and negotiable. **NCCB** "Living the Gospel of Life" 10



REFLECTION – In the Supreme Court case *Sierra v Morton* Justice Douglas wrote, "The ordinary corporation is a person . . . So it should be as respects valleys, alpine meadows, rivers, lakes, estuaries, beaches, and ridges, groves of trees, swampland or even air. A few months later he agreed with the *Roe v Wade* abortion decision, that unborn children are not persons.

In *Roe v Wade* Texas argued that "The fetus is a 'person' within the language and meaning of the Fourteenth Amendment." To which Justice Harry Blackmun responded, "If the suggestion of personhood is established, the appellant's case, of course, collapses, for the fetus' right to life would then be guaranteed specifically by the Fourteenth Amendment." However, Justice Blackmun then came to the conclusion "That the word 'person,' as used the Fourteenth Amendment, does not include the unborn."

Statement, American College of Pediatricians – March 2017

The predominance of human biological research confirms that human life begins at conception-fertilization. At fertilization, the human being emerges as a whole genetically distinct, individuated zygotic living human organism, a member of the species *Homo sapiens*, needing only the proper environment in order to grow and develop. The difference between the individual in its adult stage and in its zygotic stage is one of form, not nature. This statement focuses on scientific evidence of when an individual human life begins.

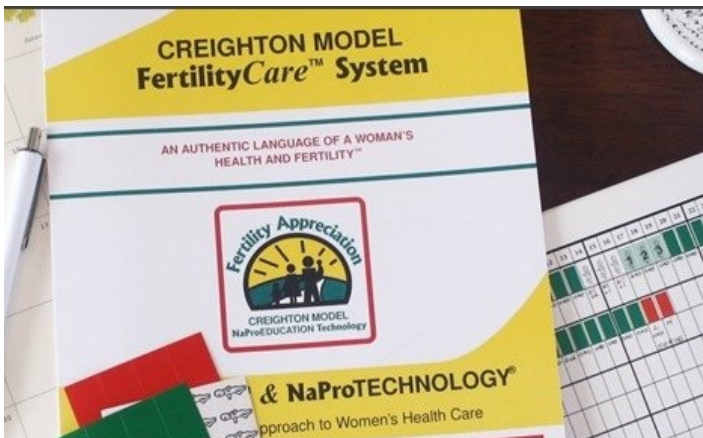
Prayer for an End to Infanticide

Please note that the jail ministry requires only one to two hours per month; women minister to women; and men minister to men.
