

REFLECTION – In February the New Mexico State House of Representatives passed HB 51, a radical abortion/infanticide bill. Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham, who identified herself as a Catholic, expressed her support for the bill. Prior to the vote on the abortion bill in the Senate, the New Mexico Alliance for Life presented the signatures of more than 22,000 New Mexicans urging lawmakers to oppose HB – 51. In addition hundreds more of pro-lifers gathered in the Capitol to protest the radical pro-abortion bill. In a rare show of bi-partisanship 16 Republicans were joined by 8 Democrats to soundly defeat the anti-human life proposed law.


Meanwhile, the city of Roswell, New Mexico was making its own, *loud and clear*, statement on the inherent dignity of pre-born children. The City Council, on March 14, 2019 passed a resolution declaring its jurisdiction to be in support of "fetal-life," something local pro-life advocates say makes Roswell a "sanctuary city for the pre-born." The resolution also states that the City Council declares "its opposition to any decrease, by the New Mexico State Legislature, of laws that makes abortion illegal" and "honors the rights of healthcare providers to object on moral grounds to performing abortions, and opposes any regulation or law seeking to violate that right."

Please note that we will continue the previously established practice of never using incense for the first Mass of any weekend or Holy Day of Obligation.

During Lent and Advent, however, the Sunday 8am Mass will always be incense free, as well.
