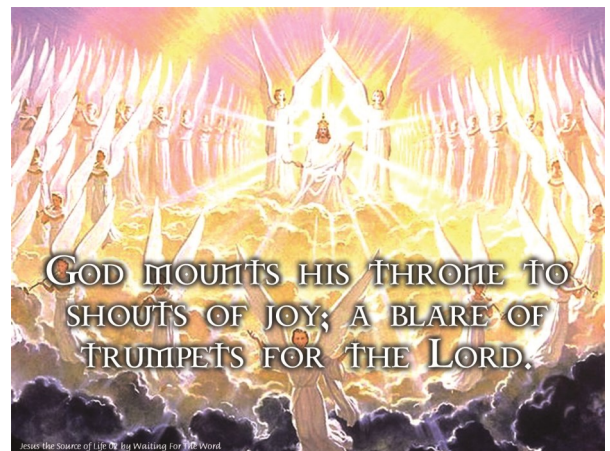

Mother Teresa's Pro-Life Discourse to the 1994 National Prayer Breakfast in Washington D.C.

An estimated 3,000 people attended the Feb. 3, 1994 National Prayer Breakfast in Washington D.C. Attendees included President Clinton and his wife Hillary and Vice President Al Gore and his wife Tipper. Members of Congress and the Supreme Court were also in attendance. St. Mother Teresa thus began her message on the value of all life:

"I feel that the greatest destroyer of peace in the world today is abortion, because it is a war against the child, the direct killing of the innocent child, murder by the mother herself. And if we accept that a mother can kill even her own child, how can we tell other people not to kill one another? How do we persuade a woman not to have an abortion? As always we must persuade her with love and we remind ourselves that love means to be willing to give until it hurts. Jesus gave even His life to love us. So, the mother who is thinking of abortion should be helped to love, that is, to give until it hurts her plans, or her free time, to respect the life of her child. The father of that child, whoever he is, must also give until it hurts." (Continued next week)
