Fundamental Right and Elections As the election draws near, we are hearing more and more about health care, education, the war on terrorism, and other important

topics. All of these are, to be sure, very important. However, the most important topic is the one that few people (particularly politicians) want to talk about: abortion. One might ask, "But how is abortion more important than quality education?" Easy. A child cannot receive a quality education once he/she is aborted. It is certainly a noble goal to ensure that every child receives a quality education, but when one-third of children die before they reach kindergarten, we have failed in providing them with a quality education. The same is true for other issues. Certainly children should have access to proper health care, but why is health care important? Health care is important because we value human life and seek to protect it from harm. Abortion, conversely, says that the purpose of health care is to destroy life, not to nurture it. 




