GREAT NEWS!! The Family Foundation (kentuckyfamily.org) reports that:

Senate Bill 9 passed the State House with vote of 76-18 [passed State Senate 32-4]. Senate Bill 9, the "Born-Alive Infant Protection Act," requires that medical care be given to any child that is born alive, including those born during

an abortion.

House Bill 2 passed the State Senate with vote of 30-5 [passed State House 75-18]. House Bill 2 grants authority to the Attorney General to enforce abortion law. This means that the ongoing involvement of the University of Louisville with the EMW abortion clinic CAN be investigated to see if state funds were used.

If Gov. Beshear vetoes these bills, the Assembly will have the opportunity to override his veto in early February.

Dear Saint James Parishioners,

I would like to thank you all for your continued support of the parish and would like to draw your attention to two announcements.

Due to COVID-19 and the current pandemic, many of us have had to change how we perform many tasks in our day-to-day lives. As we quickly approach the Season of Lent with Ash Wednesday on February 17th, Ash Wednesday Mass will also be different as it pertains to the distribution of ashes. As some of you may have already heard, the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments in Rome published a note addressed to all priests on January 12th, modifying the distribution of ashes. In the note, the priest is to bless the ashes, sprinkle them with holy water, and say only once the invocation, "Repent and believe in the Gospel", or "Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return" instead of repeating the invocation for each person who receives ashes. Furthermore, instead of receiving the ashes on the forehead, the imposition of ashes will be done by sprinkling the ashes on the head of each person, while saying nothing. The manner in which we will distribute ashes this year will look exactly how we proceed with the distribution of Holy Communion on Sundays. Instead of forming lines to come up to receive ashes, each person will remain at their seat, standing, and the person distributing the ashes will come to each person. After receiving the imposition of ashes, then you may be seated again.

Likewise, Archbishop Kurtz and the Office of Worship for the Archdiocese of Louisville have urged that parishes adopt the same practice for the Feast of Saint Blaise on February 3rd. Instead of each person receiving the blessing individually, the blessing will be pronounced once over the congregation.

Please be assured of my prayers for you and your families as we move through Ordinary Time after Epiphany and prepare for the Season of Lent. As always, if you have any questions or concerns please contact me directly at frkrust@stjames-etown.org. God bless!

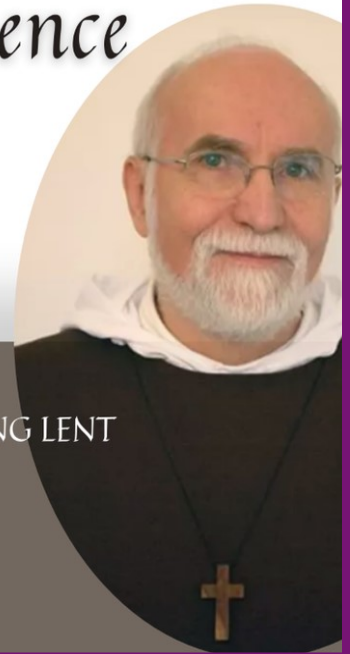
