Dear Saint James Parishioners,

I would like to thank you all for your continued support of the parish and would like to draw your attention to an announcement.

Due to COVID-19 and the current pandemic, many of us have had to change how we perform many tasks in our day-to-day lives. As we quickly approach the Season of Lent with Ash Wednesday on February 17th, Ash Wednesday Mass will also be different as it pertains to the distribution of ashes. As some of you may have already heard, the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments in Rome published a note addressed to all priests on January 12th, modifying the distribution of ashes. In the note, the priest is to bless the ashes, sprinkle them with holy water, and say only once the invocation, "Repent and believe in the Gospel", or "Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return" instead of repeating the invocation for each person who receives ashes. Furthermore, instead of receiving the ashes on the forehead, the imposition of ashes will be done by sprinkling the ashes on the head of each person, while saying nothing. The manner in which we will distribute ashes this year will look exactly how we proceed with the distribution of Holy Communion on Sundays. Instead of forming lines to come up to receive ashes, each person will remain at their seat, standing, and the person distributing the ashes will come to each person. After receiving the imposition of ashes, then you may be seated again.

Please be assured of my prayers for you and your families as we move through Ordinary Time after Epiphany and prepare for the Season of Lent. As always, if you have any questions or concerns please contact me directly at frkrust@stjames-etown.org. God bless!





Stewardship Reflection Lisa Moore

My faith has always been an integral part of my life. However, I often felt isolated and would leave Mass with little emotion or insight. Something had to change and I knew that I was



the only one who could make those changes.

Father Martin's arrival at St. James in 2014 significantly impacted my spiritual journey. In his initial homily, he advised the parishioners, "My job is to get you to Heaven." As weeks passed, I started to see fellow volunteers at Mass and realized I had a group of new friends who were also actively pursuing their journey of faith and helping me do the same.

Through my ministry involvement with St. Vincent De-Paul, Stewardship and other ministries, I now realize that stewardship is identifying our talents and giving to others. In order to serve God, I had to challenge myself and accept that stewardship and faith are not simple doctrines but necessary actions in our journey of faith.
