As Catholics we rightly find inspiration in Mary's beautiful "fiat", her "yes" to God's will at the Annunciation, but we should also recall Joseph's own faithful "yes" to God's plan for salvation. Despite the unusual circumstances of Mary's pregnancy, "Joseph accept-

ed Mary unconditionally" (Patris corde, 4). Through a series of dreams, God made his will known to Joseph, and each time Joseph faithfully responded. It is Joseph who welcomed the Christ child as his own son, gave Jesus his name as revealed by the angel, and continually protected and provided for the needs of the Holy Family. When Herod threatened the life of the infant Jesus, Joseph fled with his family from their homeland to Egypt and patiently waited until they could return to Israel. "In every situation, Joseph declared his own 'fiat'" (PC, 3). Through his constant care for both mother and child, Joseph makes a true gift of himself. God chose this humble carpenter of Nazareth to guide the beginnings of our redemption, and it is

Joseph "who was able to turn a problem into a possibility by trusting always in divine providence" (PC, 5). Inspired by St. Joseph, may we proactively help mothers welcome and care for the gift of new life.



Volunteerism has always been important to us and we have been fortunate throughout the years to have assisted our communities in a variety of ways. We wanted to pass that sense of service on to our children and St. James has certainly helped us encourage that responsibility. From the time they entered St James School, our stewardship efforts were focused there. Our family has served at SJS in a variety of ways including altar serving, room parent, the spirit store, library, Black & White Knight, and Field Day and we have appreciated the opportunity to help a cause that was so near and dear to us.



A few years ago, we needed something different. With our oldest in high school, we wanted something that allowed us to work together. After encouragement from friends, we decided as a family to serve at Room in the Inn and volunteered to help set up and socialize with the guests. It's only 3 nights a year, but it offers a very personal stewardship experience. Our girls have been taught to lend a hand from an early age, but this was probably the first time they had such a direct interaction with people who needed a different kind of help. It has opened all of our eyes to the plight of people who are homeless, often through no fault of their own. We have gotten to know their personalities, share stories with them, and laugh at each other's jokes. We have also enjoyed getting to work alongside our fellow volunteers--church family whom we simply didn't have the opportunity to interact with before. In all honesty, sometimes it's difficult to be excited about going, especially in December when there are often more festive events occurring. However, after every evening spent there, it never fails that on the ride home, one of us says "I'm glad we could be there tonight." If you've ever considered Room in the Inn, but have just been a little hesitant, we encourage you to try it out. There is always something that needs to be done and as Sister Michael Marie always said "Many hands make light work."
