**Solemnidad de Nuestro Señor Jesucristo,
Rey del Universo
Comunidad Hispana- Misa Dominical en Español
Eduquémonos en la Fe**

La Unción de los Enfermos es el sacramento que reciben los que están enfermos o sufriendo. Por la unción sagrada y la oración del sacerdote, la iglesia entera encomienda a Cristo a los están enfermos. La persona enferma recibe los dones del Espíritu Santo de Fortaleza, fe, paz, y coraje, y su sufrimiento se une al sufrimiento de Cristo para la edificación de la Iglesia.

Con el sacramento de la Unción de los Enfermos la Iglesia lleva a cabo la misión de Jesús de brindar compasión y curación a los enfermos. Quien está enfermo también puede atender a otros. Uniendo su sufrimiento a Cristo, los que están enfermos pueden ser signos de fe y testigos de la resurrección de Cristo ante toda la comunidad.

Este sacramento es una celebración comunitaria ya que se celebra “de forma litúrgica y comunitaria”. En el hogar, el hospital o la iglesia, los miembros del Cuerpo de Cristo se reúnen para el rito sacramental encabezado por un sacerdote. El rito penitencial seguido de la liturgia de la Palabra y la unción sacramental de los enfermos inspira y conforta al enfermo y sus familiares. La unción con el óleo Sagrado es un signo de bendición del Espíritu Santo. EL óleo de los enfermos, que recibe una bendición diferente del Crisma, el óleo usado durante el Bautismo, la Confirmación y el orden Sagrado, recuerda la participación de la comunidad en el Espíritu Santo y la conexión de la persona enferma con el entero cuerpo de Cristo y la comunión de los santos. Es posible que el sacramento pueda tener curación física, la Unción de los Enfermos tiene que ver principalmente con la curación de la Esperanza y del Espíritu. Sobre todo, el sacramento permite a la persona que está enferma unirse estrechamente a la Pasión de Cristo.

Estamos llamados a confortar, orar y ser solidarios con todos lo que están enfermos y sufren. Cuidar de los que sufren no es una carga sino un regalo. Los que cuidan de los enfermos hacen el trabajo Sagrado e importante; caminan con el pueblo sufriente de Cristo y de esa manera sirven a Cristo mismo.



Dear Parishioners,

Greetings from St. James! As the liturgical year draws to a close with the Solemnity of Christ the King, we find ourselves preparing to begin anew with the season of Advent and our anticipation of the coming of Christ among us. This moment presents a fine opportunity to share two updates regarding our parish community.

You may not be aware that two endowed funds exist that provide ongoing support for our parish and school communities. In the summer of 2019 the Saint James Catholic Church Endowment was established by a donation from a committed member of St. James to provide long-term financial security for the parish in support of its ongoing mission. The purpose of the endowment is to grow the principal of the fund while generating income each year from the interest. There is no limit to the number of donors who may contribute to the fund and a gift of any size is encouraged. The Central Kentucky Community Foundation manages the fund and the Finance Council in conjunction with the Pastor is entrusted with the authority to allocate income from the fund where most needed.

The St. James Catholic School Tuition Assistance Endowment was likewise established by a donation from a committed member of our parish in the fall of 2021 to provide scholarship assistance in the form of grants to help defray the cost of a Catholic education for students who meet specific criteria regarding desire for enrollment, qualification for admission and financial need. Presently our pre-K through 8th grade enrollment for the 2021-2022 academic year stands at a 16% increase from the previous academic year. At your discretion, the endowment allows for 50% of your gift to be used in the upcoming school year with 50% remaining in the endowment to facilitate sustainable tuition assistance for future generations of students. As our parish school continues to grow the need to join in supporting the generous families who send their children to learn at St. James presents itself to us. In the end, the growth of both Endowments grant to the parish and school collectively, prudent avenues to help address the remaining debt on St. James School of \$6.15 million as of the end of October 2021.

For more information on either opportunity please feel free to consult with me or a member of the parish Finance Committee by contacting the parish office. You may consider either Fund as an opportunity for a year-end gift or as a tool for a legacy gift through your estate plan to support the mission of St. James. Blessings to each of you during this time of thanksgiving. Be assured of my prayers and gratitude for the opportunity to serve as Pastor of St. James. May God continue to bless you for your kindness.

This report is for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2021. We thank all our generous donors for helping us reach so many needy people in our community. Through your donations, we were able to provide the following help:

FOOD: \$53,492 (estimated retail value of food distributed); 997 households assisted with 1,645 individuals in these households.

UTILITIES: \$28,067; 195 households assisted with 397 individuals in these households.

HOUSING (rent and motel): \$9,476; 63 household assisted with 122 individuals in these households.

OTHER (bus tickets, gasoline, prescriptions): \$3,995; 306 households assisted with 572 individuals in these households.

TOTAL ASSISTANCE: \$95,030 expended to help 1,561 households with 2,736 individuals in these households.


