PARISH LIFE

Segundo Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

Comunidad Hispana-Misa Dominical

En este domingo escuchamos la historia familiar de la fiesta de bodas en Caná. Esta fiesta en Caná está estrechamente asociada con el bautismo del Señor y la adoración del niño Jesús por los Reyes Magos. La señal que Jesús realiza en la fiesta de bodas se celebra como una epifanía o una manifestación de la divinidad de Jesús.

La conciencia de la venida de la pasión y muerte de Jesús siempre está presente en el Evangelio de Juan. Incluso en esta historia de la primera señal de Jesús, el lenguaje utilizado presagia la pasión de Jesús. Cuando Jesús le dice a su madre que su hora aún no ha llegado, protesta contra sus deseos en un lenguaje que Juan usará nuevamente al informar la Última Cena de Jesús con sus discípulos. Al presentar la historia de Jesús lavando los pies de sus discípulos, Juan escribe que Jesús sabía que su hora había llegado. En el Evangelio de Juan, Jesús está muy al mando y consciente de todo lo que le va a suceder.

Aquí, en el Evangelio de Juan, María no se menciona por su nombre, sino que se la conoce como la madre de Jesús. María es influyente en la primera señal de Jesús. Ella también estará presente en su Crucifixión, testigo de la manifestación final de su divinidad.

El Evangelio de Juan describe siete señales que indican la identidad de Jesús a sus discípulos. Juan nunca habla de estas señales como milagros porque su importancia no está en la acción que Jesús realiza, sino en lo que estas obras indican acerca de la identidad de Jesús. Aquí, como cuando Juan describe las otras señales, se dice que los discípulos comienzan a creer, pero no se menciona si los otros invitados a la boda son conscientes de lo que ha sucedido.

Esta súper respuesta a una simple necesidad humana es una visión para nosotros de la superabundancia del reino de Dios. Nos desafía a responder generosamente cuando nos enfrentamos a las necesidades humanas de hoy. Respondemos lo mejor que podemos, plenamente seguros de que Dios puede transformar nuestros esfuerzos, llevando el Reino de Dios a la realización entre nosotros.

God, our Spouse and Lord of Life

"As a bridegroom rejoices in his bride, so shall your God rejoice in you." Today's first reading from Isaiah shows us how much God delights in human life. He rejoices in us as in a bride. He gives himself to us as a bridegroom is called to do for his beloved. He protects and defends us, and leads us to the life that never ends. His commitment

to humanity is the source of ours. Like him, we are to give ourselves for the good of others, starting with the most vulnerable lives – children at the very beginning of their development in the womb.

Moreover, this coincides with our nation's honoring of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., whose dream of equality for all under the law needs to be applied now to the children in the womb. This is a work around which Christians of all denominations should unite, and this week also marks the week of prayer for Christian Unity.



STEWARDSHIP STORY - I was recently asked why I want to do prison ministry. I am reminded in the Gospel of Matthew that Jesus says, "When I was in prison, you came to visit me." Going to the jail to visit a repeat drug offender, convicted felon, or others who have just lost their way is the last place most of us would choose to go. In the Gospels, I've learned that Jesus did not come for the righteous but for the lost, blind, and broken-hearted. Truthfully, in God's eyes, I'm not much different than those sitting in a jail cell. I fall short every day and seem to make the same mistakes over and over. If I can bring hope and encouragement to just one person and draw them closer to Jesus, then I feel like I've accomplished just a small part of God's work. Going to the jail and hearing the cell door close behind you is not an easy thing to do. But the chance of bringing one prisoner closer to Jesus Christ and changing their life forever is well worth it.
