Cuarto Domingo De Tiempo Ordinario Comunidad Hispana

Eduquémonos en la fé - Juan Bosco

San Juan Bosco nació el 16 de agosto de 1815 en Castelnuovo de Asti, y recibió de su madre Margarita Occhiena una sólida educación cristiana y humana. Dotado de inteligencia, memoria, voluntad y agilidad física no comunes, desde niño fue seguido por sus coetáneos, a quienes organizaba juegos que interrumpía al toque de las campanas para llevarlos a la iglesia. Fue ordenado sacerdote en Turín en 1841, y allí comenzó su actividad pastoral con San José Cafasso.Su programa, o mejor, su pasión era la educación de los jóvenes, los más pobres y abandonados. Reunió un grupito que llevaba a jugar, a rezar y a menudo a comer con él. La incómoda v rumorosa compañía de Don Bosco (así se lo llamaba y se lo llama familiarmente) tenía que estar cambiando de lugar continuamente hasta que por fin encontró un lugar fijo bajo el cobertizo Pinardi, que fue la primera célula del Oratorio. Con la ayuda de mamá Margarita, sin medios materiales y entre la persistente hostilidad de muchos, Don Bosco dio vida al Oratorio de San Francisco de Sales: era el lugar de encuentro dominical de los jóvenes que quisieran pasar un día de sana alegría, una pensión con escuelas de arte y oficios para los jóvenes trabajadores, y escuelas regulares para los estudios humanísticos, según una pedagogía que sería conocida en todo el mundo como "método preventivo" y basada en la religión, la razón y el amor. "La práctica del método preventivo se base toda en las palabras de San Pablo que dice: La caridad es benigna y paciente; sufre todo. pero espera todo y aguanta todo". Para asegurar la continuidad de su obra, San Juan Bosco fundó la Pía Sociedad de San Francisco de Sales (los Salesianos) y Hijas de María Auxiliadora (las Salesianas). Fue un fecundísimo escritor popular, fundó escuelas tipográficas, revistas y editoriales para el incremento de la prensa católica, la "buena prensa". Aunque ajeno a las luchas políticas, prestó su servicio como intermediario entre la Santa Sede, el gobierno italiano y la casa Saboya. Fue un santo risueño y amable, se sentía "sacerdote en la casa del pobre; sacerdote en el palacio del Rey y de los Ministros". Buen polemista contra la secta de los Valdeses, según la mentalidad del tiempo, nunca se avergonzó de sus amistades con los protestantes y los hebreos de buena voluntad: "Condenamos los errores, escribió en el "Católico", pero respetamos siempre a las personas". Being a person of life while living amidst a culture of death requires the lessons of today's first reading and gospel regarding what a prophet faces. We are all prophets by our baptism, and therefore share both in the blessings and burdens of that particular

vocation. We are blessed in that we have and know with certainty the Word and will of God regarding the sanctity of life. The burden we have is that we must speak that word – in fact, proclaim it – amidst people who may not necessarily want to hear it. The lesson of these readings is that a) we should expect opposition, not be surprised at it, and b) we should not measure the success of the prophetic mission by how well we are accepted, but rather by how faithful and loving we are in carrying out the mission entrusted to us.

The prophetic stance we take on behalf of life is not only a stance of example, but also of word. The good example we set must at times be explained. Pope Paul VI (who is now a canonized saint) in his landmark document "Evangelii Nuntiandi" (On Evangelization in the Modern World) made this point when he explained that the witness of life must at times be accompanied and explained by the word of life. Our people need our encouragement – as well as concrete tools – to be able to explain their pro-life position.

The second reading, of course, provides an entire lesson in itself about the meaning of love. The pro-life movement is a movement of love. It can be summed up as a movement which objects to the fact that the unborn are excluded from the most basic requirement of love (that is, the protection of one's life), and which loves them intensely in order to make up for the lack of love they receive from others. Love ultimately says, "I sacrifice myself for the good of the other." Abortion says, "I sacrifice the other for the good of myself."




