PARISH LIFE



Sexto Domingo De Tiempo Ordinario Comunidad Hispana

Eduquémonos en la fé Patronos de Europa Eran dos hermanos. En el mundo se llamaban Constanino y Miguel. Recibieron sus nombres de Cirilo y Metodio al entrar a la vida religiosa. Son los dos grandes apóstoles de los países eslavos, como por ejemplo: Yugoslavia,

Checoslovaquia, Bulgaria, Serbia, Croacia, etc. Nacieron en Tesalónica, Grecia. Su padre era un importante funcionario gubernamental. En su ciudad se hablaban varios idiomas, y entre ellos el eslavo. Fueron siete hermanos. Metodio era el mayor y Cirilo el menor de todos.

Cirilo y Metodio ejercieron su misión evangelizadora en el imperio de la Gran Moravia. Este Estado surgió a comienzos del siglo noveno. Su centro se hallaba en Moravia, en la actualidad parte oriental de la República Checa. También pertenecían a la Gran Moravia territorios eslovacos y su influencia se extendía hasta Bohemia.

En la Gran Moravia propagaban el cristianismo misioneros de Italia Septentrional y principalmente de la vecina Baviera. A mediados del siglo noveno Moravia ya era cristiana, mas el príncipe Rostislav, deseando obtener plena independencia con respecto al imperio franco oriental - la posterior Alemania-, solicitó al emperador de Bizancio, Miguel III, de Constantinopla, el envío de sacerdotes cultos que afianzasen el cristianismo en la Gran Moravia y estableciesen una organización eclesiástica independiente de Baviera. El emperador de Bizancio encargó la misión a dos cultos hermanos, Cirilo y Metodio, oriundos de Salónica, que dominaban la lengua eslava.

Cirilo y Metodio llegaron al imperio de la Gran Moravia en el año 863 y desarrollaron aquí una extraordinaria labor religiosa y cultural. Los hermanos Cirilo y Metodio nacieron en el seno de una familia griega radicada en Salónica. Cirilo cuya labor misionera en la Gran Moravia se extendiera durante cuatro años, aportó grande y fundamentalmente la cultura granmorava, así por ejemplo, el alfabeto compuesto de 38 letras, el que reflejaba la gran riqueza sonora del eslavo antiguo. La escritura eslava de Cirilo recibió el nombre de glagólica.

Cirilo es también el fundador de la literatura eslava. Elaborada la escritura eslava, de inmediato se enfrascó en la traducción de libros religiosos al eslavo antiguo. El primer libro traducido por Cirilo fue el evangeliario, elemento indispensable para celebrar las misas y para la catequesis. Con ayuda de sus discípulos vertió al eslavo antiguo también el misal, el apostolario y otros libros litúrgicos.

Al concluir en Moravia la traducción de los cuatro evangelios, Cirilo escribió el prólogo de esta obra, llamado Proglas. Se trata de una composición poética, escrita en versos, según los cánones griegos, considerada una obra fundamental de la literatura eslava.

Saint James Ministerio Hispano



Abortion is not only a sin against life; it is a sin against hope. We trust our own (or others') evaluation of the problems in our lives and in the world, and decide that the world is too inhospitable for a child to be welcomed into it. The first

reading, therefore, with its exhortation to hope in the Lord, speaks right to the heart of the culture of life. The pro-life movement is focused on inspiring the hope that brings the courage to say yes to life.

This hope is based ultimately in what the second reading identifies as the foundation of our faith: Christ is indeed raised from the dead. The evils we fight, like abortion, are ultimately defeated already at their root, because the kingdom of death has already been overturned.

These truths of the first and second readings provide the basis for the beatitudes, each of which can be applied to the pro-life witness of the Church: "Blessed are you poor." Biblically, the "poor" are those who have no help but God. The "poor" are not simply the materially disadvantaged, but rather those who are marginalized by society. The children living in the womb are truly the poorest of the poor, and the Church's preferential option for the poor requires that we give them priority attention. These children are the only group of people in our society whose very right to life is formally and explicitly denied by public policy.

"Blessed are you who are now hungry." We are hungry for justice to be established; the unborn are hungry for their most basic rights to be recognized.

"Blessed are you who weep." If we are to be builders of the culture of life, we must first learn to weep over the culture of death. The evil of abortion must break our hearts. Only then are our hearts opened to receive the grace and strength to witness and battle against this evil.

"Blessed are you when people hate you." Defenders of the unborn are hated by many in the world today, who see them as a threat to human rights, as enemies of women's rights and health, as opponents of freedom itself. Few movements can give one as direct an experience of this particular beatitude than the pro-life movement – which is precisely why it is a blessing to be involved in it.




