**Septimo Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario
Comunidad Hispana**

El evangelio de hoy nos ofrece el gran desafío para un discípulo de Jesús:

"Ama a tus enemigos, haz el bien a los que no te gustan, bendice a los que hablan mal de ti y ora por los que te maltratan". "Sed misericordiosos como vuestro Padre celestial es misericordioso".

Todos sabemos lo difícil que es hacer esto.

Nunca podremos hacerlo sin la gracia de Dios, sin aprender a ser muy conscientes de que Dios está presente con nosotros cada día, sin pedirle a Dios la fuerza de su gracia muchas veces al día. La invitación de Jesús a amar a aquellos que se nos meten en la cara, que saben apretar todos nuestros botones, va en contra de nuestros sentimientos naturales de irritación y enojo. Jesús parece estar pidiendo demasiado.

Lo que Jesús nos está pidiendo es que seamos todo lo que la gracia nos permite ser. Por nuestro bautismo, se nos ha dado una participación en la vida y el amor de Dios. Jesús se ha convertido en nuestro hermano; somos hijos de nuestro Padre celestial por gracia. La vida divina está en nosotros y esa vida nos permite vivir como Jesús vivió.

Jesús nos está pidiendo que aprendamos a vivir por la nueva vida que se nos ha dado. Debido a la gracia, somos capaces de ser misericordiosos como nuestro Padre es misericordioso. Jesús nos ha mostrado cómo amar a los que nos irritan, cómo perdonar a los que nos lastiman. San Francisco de Sales recomienda varias prácticas que pueden ayudarnos a recordar la fuerza de la vida divina dentro de nosotros.

Comience el día con una breve oración de conciencia:

"Dios mío, estás aquí amándome hoy; ayúdame a recordar que estás conmigo a medida que avanzamos en el día". Luego, hable con Dios sobre la gracia que necesitaré para tratar con personas particulares en mi vida que pueden irritarme o haberme maltratado. Durante el día, cuando sé que voy a conocer a esa persona, le pido la ayuda de Dios para poder relacionarme con esa persona de una manera que sea agradable a Dios. Luego, cada noche, agradezco a Dios por los momentos en que la gracia me dio fuerza y pido perdón por las veces que olvidé pedir la ayuda de Dios y fracasé porque traté de hacerlo por mi cuenta.

La clave es aprender la disciplina de recordar que comparto la vida divina. Cuando mi oración me lleve a una mayor conciencia de la presencia amorosa de Dios cada día, entonces es más probable que me vuelva dependiente de la gracia que Dios pone a mi disposición. Entonces, el desafío que Jesús ofrece, amar a mis enemigos, no es tan imposible de enfrentar para mí. Puedo cumplirlo porque confío en Dios que vive en mí.

¡Bendiciones para todos!



"If you love those who love you, what credit is that to you?...If you do good to those who do good to you, what credit is that to you?...Lend expecting nothing back...Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful."

This Gospel passage calls us to a high standard of love, set by the example of God himself. It is particularly appropriate to draw out the application of this standard for the pro-life efforts of God's people. In striving to restore protection to the most vulnerable members of our society – the unborn, and those whose illnesses have rendered them incapable of responding – we are in fact loving those who cannot love us back, and doing good to those who cannot do good in return. Loving the unborn and unresponsive necessarily requires a love that is free of the motive of looking for something in return.

Nor is that love judgmental, as many abortion supporters accuse us of being. Today's passage, "Stop judging and you will not be judged" provides preachers with an opportunity to clarify a much-abused quote of Jesus. In an age of moral relativism, some try to use this quote to defend relativism, and want it to mean, "Don't judge anyone for what they do, because you really don't know if it's right or wrong. You have your standards and they have theirs. Who are you to say what pleases God?"

Of course, we would not be able to say what pleases God, were it not for the fact that he has told us. Speaking both through reason and his revealed word, God has given us the ability to know right from wrong. In that sense, we can and must judge the difference. What we cannot judge is the inner state of a person's soul, or the motives of the heart. But if we were not able to judge the difference between right and wrong, then neither could we say "Do not judge," for that itself is a judgment that judging is wrong.

When it comes to abortion, we can and must judge the action to be always wrong. Killing a baby is as wrong as killing a person who is walking down the street. We do not condemn the person who does either act, but rather we call them to conversion and forgiveness. Yet neither can we ever claim ignorance that the violence they have committed is never morally tolerable for the children of God.

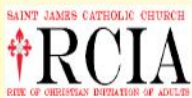

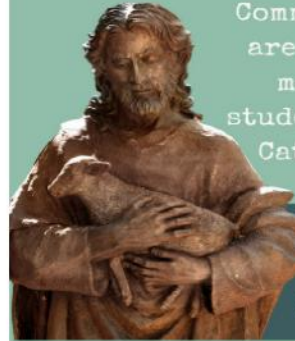
