Primer Domingo De Cuaresma Comunidad Hispana

La Cuaresma nos propone tres objetivos; el ayuno, la oración y la limosna encaminados a transformar la vida y reforestar el corazón.

"El ayuno está orientado a cambiar nuestra actitud con los demás y con las criaturas.

Qué son el ayuno y la abstinencia y cómo se viven?

El ayuno se practica el miércoles de ceniza y el viernes santo, y la abstinencia ambos días y todos los viernes de cuaresma.

El ayuno y la abstinencia es una obligación de la Iglesia Católica para todas aquellas personas que quieran voluntariamente seguir a Cristo. En términos teóricos es muy sencillo: el ayuno significa renunciar a la comida, y la abstinencia renunciar a comer carne.

Se le pide ayunar a las personas desde los 18 hasta los 59 años. Y esto implica no comer entre horas y hacer una sola comida al día. La Iglesia pide esta penitencia únicamente el miércoles de ceniza y el viernes santo. La abstinencia implica a partir de los 14 años de edad y hasta la vida eterna. Consiste en no comer carne y se realiza el miércoles de ceniza, el viernes santo y todos los viernes de cuaresma -aunque la Iglesia recomienda extenderlo a todo el año-.

Esta renuncia tiene un sentido y hay que entenderlo para vivirlo correctamente. Lo importante no es el hecho de no comer o no comer carne -aunque también es importante-, sino entender que este acto se realiza como penitencia, y para acercarse un poco a eso que estamos viviendo: la fiesta más importante para los católicos: la pasión y la resurrección de Jesús.

El ayuno en el Evangelio

En el Evangelio, Jesús nos da algunas 'pistas' de cómo vivir el ayuno y su verdadero sentido. Por ejemplo, en la lectura de (Mateo 6,1-6.16-18), nos habla sobre cuál es la forma adecuada de vivirlo:

"Cuando ayunéis, no andéis cabizbajos, como los hipócritas que desfiguran su cara para hacer ver a la gente que ayunan."

En otro momento de la vida de Jesús, le acusan de comer "con pecadores" cuando debería estar ayunando y Él responde así (Mateo 9:10-13):

Hora santa todos los jueves a las 7:00 pm en la iglesia.

Retiro de cuaresma será el sábado 12 de marzo de 9:00 am a 3:00pm. Están todos invitados.

Lent and Life

Anyone who makes the Lenten journey is called to be more alert to the attacks on human life and dignity around them. The people of life are called to reject sin and all the devil's works and empty promises (Renewal of Baptismal Promises, Easter Liturgy). The "pro-choice" and "right to die" mentalities are two of those "empty promises" which are firmly rejected by the baptized. A firm rejection of these positions is integral to repentance. Lent is the perfect time for us to call our congregations to a clearer understanding of why this is true, and to lead them to a deeper affirmation of life, both natural and eternal, in the celebration of the Paschal Mystery.

The dynamics of baptism are those of life, welcome, and mutual responsibility. Baptism immerses us into the death and resurrection of Christ, by which death in all its forms is destroyed. Moreover, God's sovereign choice is the first step in the process. He has chosen us, and He has chosen our brothers and sisters in the family of the Church that comes about through baptism. Hence, we learn that we have responsibility not only for those we "choose," but for those whom God chooses to entrust to our care.

The penitential preparation for baptism -- whether for its reception or renewal -- is necessary precisely because the dynamics of sin lead us to exalt our own "choices" over and above the moral demands of justice and charity. Sin, furthermore, obscures our judgment about the dignity and rights of others, and makes us all too ready to ignore them. Hence, the sacrament by which we become brothers and sisters in One Body is also the sacrament of "enlightenment."

The temptations of Jesus, summarized in today's Gospel passage, also summarize our own. Living on bread alone would imply that the economic challenges of having a child become more determinative than the value of that child. Worshiping anyone other than the Lord our God would imply that our own will is more important in the end than God's. Finally, failing to trust in the Lord alone, and his provision for our future, can lead us to resort to violent acts like abortion to try to control that future or surmount an obstacle in the way of what we think should happen.

The shape of Lenten penance derives from fighting these temptations, and fostering a more pure and trusting dependence on God. That is what also builds a culture of life.

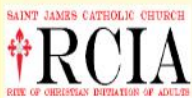

2022 PTPA – ST. JAMES HAITI COMMITTEE *UPDATE*
Sister Parish, St. Marc, St. Marc, Haiti

For our new parishioners: The city of St. Marc is on the western coast approximately sixty miles north of Port Au Prince. With God's blessing, our St. James parish twinning activity with St. Marc parish has endured since 1991. Through the love, compassion, and generosity of our St. James parishioners during these past years many basic needs have been met: a water purification system, bathrooms for the church, a large generator; renovations of both St. Marc Church and their 18th century rectory. For a number of years, we lent support to the Primary School, two Home Economics classes and with our support a Technology School has been built. It opened in 2018 with seventy-five students. Enrollment has continued. The Archbishop has assigned a priest as director of the school. During 2021, we participated in a matching funds program by Food For The Poor, through PTPA \$4,000.00 worth of rice and beans were provided St. Marc at a cost to us of \$2,000.00.

Other assistance of major importance are the salaries for catechists who take the Word of God to the many chapels of St. Marc. We helped to provide a radio station where the rosary is said daily and St. Marc parish can stay in contact with those whom the clergy can physically reach only one a month. We were able, with the people doing the work, to assist in taking the parishioners of Barbe Chapel from a dirt floor and leaking tin roof structure to a decent place of worship and in past years assisted in the building of one other chapel.

Everyone ~ Thank you for your monthly donations: They sustain our quarterly donation to our sister parish and St. Marc Tech School. Because of good communication with St. Marc's pastor, Fr. Venel Suffrard, we are able to know of the help with special needs of the parish. Recently we have received a request for EDH clean energy batteries and solar panels which provide huge savings to the parish. The current batteries are four years old and failing. Also, the cost of fuel has increased 100%.

PTPA (Parish Twinning of the America's) requires a twinned parish to submit a quarterly report to both the PTPA Office and their U.S. twinned parish. The report is to list how donated money has been spent for the needs of the parish, including aid to the poorest of the poor who come in need of help.

We make annual shipments to St. Marc through PTPA. Our collection period this year is from **March 2 to April 6**. Our storage space is now on church property.

Call Lois Shinkle 270-765-7559 to arrange drop-offs. **Do not leave items in the church!!! Donations may also be dropped off at the Shinkle's** (621 Cherrywood Drive, Elizabethtown). Call ahead (cell 270-317-3277). If necessary, you may leave items in their carport. They will not be out of town.

Please consider a monetary donation: Your Haiti Committee purchases special items that have not or cannot be donated. Also, there are the shipping costs that increase each year. Transporting our shipment to the PTPA rented warehouse space in Nashville has been faithfully donated by Nall's Specialize Hauling, a much-appreciated savings.
