The Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

PARISH LIFE



As Moses said, the law of God “is not too mysterious and remote.” Often people complicate the Church’s pro-life teaching unnecessarily. In reality, it is simple. We are called to love people, not kill them. “Love your neighbor as yourself,” as the Gospel indicates. It seems that the scholar of the law thought the teachings were “too mysterious and remote.”

Both the first reading, with the exhortation, “You have only to carry out,” and the Gospel passage, with its concluding command, “Go and do likewise,” call us beyond being pro-life in attitude to becoming pro-life in behavior. It is not enough for us to “believe” abortion is wrong; we have to intervene for those in danger of being aborted. The man who fell in with robbers, and in danger of losing his life, is also the unborn child. Many pass along the way and do nothing. They let them die. The priest and Levite knew the words of Moses in today’s first reading. They failed, however, to carry out those words.

The reason may be that they were afraid that this was a trap. Maybe the robbers were around the next curve of this road from Jerusalem to Jericho, which had come to be known as “The Bloody Pass,” and were ready to attack anyone who would stop to help the victim. The mistake that the priest and Levite made was that they asked, “If I stop to help this man, what will happen to me?” The Samaritan reversed the question, as we are called to do, and asked, “If I do not stop to help this man, what will happen to him?” And so we must ask in regard to the unborn. Stop counting the cost and calculating the risk to yourself; start thinking about the risk to them.

All of our pro-life activity flows from our union with Christ. The second reading today is actually a commentary on the first few words of the Bible, “In the beginning, God created...” Paul shows us that this “beginning” is Christ. He is the source and purpose of all life, of all creation. To stand with him, then, is to stand with life, and against all that destroys it.

Décimo Quinto Domingo de Tiempo Ordinario

Era muy común que los líderes religiosos intentaran poner en vergüenza a Jesús a través de preguntas con doble sentido. En este caso, podemos apreciar la forma magistral en que Jesús responde y corrige un error de contenido en relación al manejo que se le daba culturalmente al concepto de prójimo.

El interlocutor de Jesús hace dos preguntas. La pregunta inicial fue: “¿haciendo qué cosa heredaré la vida eterna?”. La metodología de Jesús para responder es muy curiosa. Jesús formula otra pregunta y cuando su interlocutor responde, da la respuesta por correcta y le envía a ponerlo en práctica. La segunda pregunta a Jesús fue: “¿Y quién es mi prójimo?”. Para dar respuesta a esta segunda pregunta, Jesús hace uso de una historia que mantiene cautivos a los oyentes; en primer lugar por ser un evento muy común y en segundo lugar, porque esperan el desenlace. Al finalizar la historia, Jesús formula una pregunta, da la respuesta por correcta y envía al intérprete de la ley a ponerlo por práctica.

La historia trata de un hombre, probablemente judío, quien bajaba de Jerusalén camino a Jericó; fue asaltado, golpeado y dado por muerto, siendo abandonado a la orilla del camino. Pasaron un sacerdote y un levita. Ninguno de los dos lo auxilió por temor a contaminarse. Después pasó un samaritano, quien sí se acercó y lo auxilió; lo llevó a un mesón y cubrió todos los gastos hasta que se reestableciera, ofreciéndose a pagar más si los gastos superaban los dos denarios que dejó como cobertura.

La historia adquiere mayor significado cuando analizamos algunos aspectos:

1. Los oyentes sabían que ese camino era un lugar propicio para que los asaltantes se mantuvieran al acecho de víctimas sin ser descubiertos. El historiador judío Josefo lo denomina “El camino rojo o camino de sangre.”
2. Seguramente se cuestionó a este varón que fue asaltado por atreverse a ir por ese camino con posesiones.
3. El sacerdote y el levita antepusieron las tradiciones religiosas (evitar acercarse a alguien que quizá estuviera muerto) a las demandas que establece la ley sobre el cuidado y protección a nuestro prójimo.
4. Los judíos y los samaritanos eran enemigos ancestrales, a tal grado que una partera judía negaría su auxilio a una mujer samaritana, porque ésta traería un nuevo gentil al mundo.
5. Aunque Levítico 19:18 y 34 es inclusivo en relación a quién es nuestro prójimo, lo común era que el pueblo judío, manifestando una actitud exclusivista, asumiera que el prójimo era otra persona judía.
6. De los samaritanos solo se esperaban acciones negativas y desagradables.

Así el prójimo ya no es exclusivamente mi hermano, aquel a quien estoy unido por vínculos de sangre o nacionalidad, sino todo ser humano que requiera mi ayuda. En este concepto se centra la enseñanza de Jesucristo.

Así que nuestro prójimo es aquel vecino molesto porque el perro ladra toda la noche, el compañero que critica constantemente nuestro desempeño, el empresario que despidió a nuestro pariente, la amiga que me acompaña en cada etapa de mi vida, el hijo que me da satisfacciones, etc. En resumen, nuestro prójimo es toda aquella persona que necesite nuestra ayuda, comprensión y colaboración.


