





The Saint James Respect Life Committee, led by our Pastor and Clergy, urges you to please vote "YES" for Constitutional Amendment # 2 on your November 8th election ballot.

On the next page you will fine 2 photos of Hardin County's "County Wide Composite Ballot" for the November 8th General Election. It includes all voting precincts in Hardin County. When you vote, you will receive a shorter ballot that is specific to your voting precinct.

- 1. On every precinct's ballot, just as in the large composite one, Amendment # 2 will be *the very last item on the ballot*. It may even be on the back of your ballot!
- 2. No matter what you vote on the rest of the ballot, <u>in order to vote YES on</u>

 <u>Amendment # 2, you must also fill in the YES box at the END of</u>

 <u>Amendment # 2 in order to vote for it.</u>

The full page photo on the next page shows just how small Constitutional Amendment # 2 appears on the ballot.

You really have to be looking for it in order to find it.

The close-up photo enables you to see the actual wording of the amendment itself exactly as it appears on your ballot. Only the words in quotation marks that follow, would be added to Kentucky's State Constitution. No other words of the Constitution would be added, subtracted or modified by Amendment # 2:

"To protect human life, nothing in this Constitution shall be construed to secure or protect a right to abortion or require the funding of abortion"





The resources used by the Outreach to assist the less fortunate in Elizabethtown and southern Hardin Co. are received from our Saint James family through your donations of food and funds as well as profits gained from shopping at the local Saint Vincent DePaul store. Thank you for your amazing generosity and for "helping us help others". Through these donations we were able to provide the following assistance:

FOOD: \$73,201 (estimated retail value of food distributed); 1,348 households assisted with 2,360 individuals assisted within these households.

UTILITIES: \$56.242: 349 households assisted with 700 individuals assisted within these households.

HOUSING (rent and motel): \$24,454; 152 households assisted with 265 individuals assisted within these house-

OTHER (bus tickets, gasoline; prescriptions): \$5,861*; 489 households assisted with 928 individuals assisted within these households.

TOTAL ASSISTANCE: \$159,758 expended to help 2,338 households with 4,253 individuals assisted within these households.



PARISH COUNCIL MINUTES ~ OCTOBER 2022

October 11,2022 Parish Council Meeting

Members present were Lou Edmondson, Lorna Vertrees, Jeff Lanz, Jordan Cofer, Cheri Ellis-Reeves, CATHOLIC CHURCH Sister Augusta, Sister Mary Grace, Father Loi and Father Michael.

Meeting began with welcoming Sister Mary Grace and Jordan Cofer to the parish council. Father Michael began meeting with prayer.

Father Michael stated he had met with a couple of people to discuss St. James working with Boys and Girls Haven. A parishioner has asked if Children's church was going to start up again. Father Michael asked council information regarding this ministry since it was stopped due

to Covid before he arrived. Jeff gave information about when it was and who would oversee it. Plans are in works to honor of Sister Michael Marie. We will have more details later.

School Update-Sister Mary Grace said first quarter has been a smooth transition. Enrollment is 407, up 20 82 is preschool, 325 K-8. We are on rising trend. School motto has been modified to A Tradition of Faith, Excellence, Community. She wants the school to instill vision, joyful disciples, lifelong learners and virtuous citizens.

School is going back to pre-Covid, students are eating in lunchroom, students are able to be in small groups. MAP scores are showing growth. They are working toward the Blue Ribbon status. They are working on increasing Catholic identity into all classes, increasing community involvement and transparency. November 1st will start admission process for new students, accepting student will be in April, current students will register in February. There are 7 new committee members that will work with school board and administration on various projects. Archdiocese revamps the strategic plan annually.

Strategic Plan Committee updates

Communication - kept at status quo - no changes

Evangelization - Lou reported that each Monday a group is working through a book Contagious Catholic. They are looking for ways to strengthen their faith, help those who have fallen away. There will be a workshop provided by Catholic Education Foundation grant on October

29, 2022 on evangelization.

Faith Formation - Sister Augusta said that strategic plan steps is on track. Olivia Dvorjak has been hired to help full time with Faith Formation. Fabiola is a big help in the office. Father Jean has the desire to teach and works with Hispanic Community. Needs assessment was done on senior members of the church, Catholic Women of St. James is a thriving group, working on annual retreats. They have added a 7-8th grade youth ministry that has around 25-35 students that meet monthly.

Fellowship - Lorna said this years picnic was the best financially so far. The Hispanic community was involved with the picnic this year. They also had a Food Festival after mass one weekend and are looking to continue to build relationships with the parish as a whole.

Coffee and donuts are in plans to start up with Knights of Columbus taking it over. The ambassador program has been dropped.

Operational Vitality - Father Michael said the Finance Committee meets next week. Hard copies of Accountability Report are in back of church for parishioners to pick up if they want hard copy.

Stewardship - Lorna said they are working on Stewardship book now. The committee are looking into having members to share their story of what stewardship means to them. Stewardship weekend is planned for January 16-17th.

Worship- Jeff said they are having regular quarterly meetings, St. James is offering additional confessional times. Music has improved since Tim was hired. Tim old Jeff that cantors are having the opportunity to help with song choice, possibly a children's choir, are part of strategic planning steps. Servers are increasing at school and church.

Lou thanked everyone and said that we are in good standing in strategic planning steps.

Father Loi closed meeting with prayer.
