### PARISH LIFE



**Advent and Pregnancy** - As we enter the second half of Advent, the liturgy focuses more specifically on the Incarnation and birth of Jesus at the first Christmas. We think about Mary's initial fear and uncertainty in the face of her unexpected pregnancy. Then, in every Church in the world, believers spiritually rush to her side to eagerly await with her the birth of the Savior.

The best way for a parish to celebrate Christmas is to rush physically to the side of those in the community who, like Mary, are uncertain and afraid about their pregnancy. We are to accompany them through their pregnancy with support and encouragement, and help them experience the fact that every birth reflects the joy of the birth of Christ.

Nationwide, pregnancy centers providing alternatives to abortion can be reached through the "Option Line," <u>1-800 -712-HELP</u>, or at <u>www.pregnancycenters.org</u>.(Elizabethtown's own Clarity Solutions is at the top of that list for our area.)

The themes of joy, hope and a steady heart flow from the message of today's readings that the coming of the Lord is close at hand. The Church wants the natural joy that comes with the approach of Christmas to be illumined and lifted up by the spiritual joy that comes with the approach of Christ. This spiritual joy is rooted in hope and leads to a steadiness of heart expressed in all three of today's readings.

Steadiness of heart is what is needed as we adhere to the hope of the Gospel amidst a culture of death. The reason for this hope and steadiness is what the psalm today declares: "The Lord...secures justice for the oppressed...The Lord sets captives free." These themes, of course, are what Jesus identified as the core of his mission when he quoted Isaiah in his first sermon (see Luke 4). He comes, in other words, to save us, and to accomplish through us, the flowering of justice in the world for all human beings whose rights – starting with the most fundamental right, life itself – are denied and trampled.

When we have a "steady heart," we are able to face evil without minimizing it, and at the same time see that God is stronger than the evil, and will work through us to conquer it.

Because of this hope, a steady heart does not resort to immoral means to achieve good ends. A steady heart keeps everything in perspective, does not lose patience, and is able to work hard each day to bring into the world the fruit of the Spirit, and to help others do the same. *Priests for Life.* 



### Tercer Domingo de Adviento

Juan el Bautista se preguntaba qué estaría haciendo Jesús. Él estaba esperando un Mesías político, y no comprendía la forma en que Jesús estaba actuando. Jesús le dijo, tal como nos dice a nosotros/as: Tienes que tener fe en mí.Nuevamente tenemos esta maravillosa verdad. Juan el Bautista preparaba el camino al Señor. Y ahora que Cristo ha ganado la salvación para nosotros, somos la nueva creación, que trasciende todo lo que pasó antes, incluso al mismo Juan. Dos corrientes atraviesan las Escrituras, cuando la gente se

pregunta qué acción habrá que tomar, cuando el Señor que esperamos, finalmente llegue para regir el mundo. Una idea dominante es que el Mesías se enfocará en el castigo y la corrección: donde ha crecido la corrupción, él llevará un hacha a la raíz del árbol, o vendrá con una criba, para echar fuera los elementos nocivos, separándolos de los buenos. Aunque no impuso un régimen tan estricto de castigo como ésos, Juan Bautista insistió en altos estándares morales, y así él también se inclinó por una visión más estricta.

Aparentemente, Juan está inseguro la forma elegida por Jesús para su llegada, así que comienza a hacer preguntas. Y la respuesta de Jesús hace recordar la otra corriente, en la cual la idea dominante es reconstruir a las personas que necesitan ser sanadas. Todos los milagros aquí presentados están en línea con la visión profética de Isaías, en la cual se entrega a la gente la fortaleza y a la salvación.



# **DISCOVER** YOUR GIVING OPTIONS

### Saint James Catholic Church Endowment

This endowment was established to provide long-term financial security for the parish while supporting its mission. It is meant to grow the fund's principal while generating income yearly from the interest. There is no limit to the number of donors who may contribute to the fund, and gifts of any size are encouraged. The fund has been established with the Central Kentucky Community Foundation and will remain within its management.

### Saint James Catholic School Tuition Assistance Fund

This fund provides scholarship assistance in the form of grants to help offset the cost of a Catholic education for students at Saint James Catholic School (SJS) using the following criteria:

- · Students must be planning to attend SJS
- Students must be qualified to attend SJS based on all other requirements for admission
- Students must demonstrate a desire and financial need to achieve their educational goals

Grants can be used to help defray the full cost, or any portion of the cost, of any or all of the following:

- Tuitior
- Academic fees
- · Any required items payable directly to SJS

### **Bequest Through a Will**

You may choose to continue your stewardship by including Saint James Catholic Church or School in your will in one of the following ways:

- · A specific dollar amount
- A percentage of the value of the estate or the estate's residue
- · Real estate or personal property
- · Stocks or securities
- Insurance or retirement plan beneficiary Saint James Catholic Church or School may be named the beneficiary of a life insurance policy or retirement plan such as an IRA, 401k, or 403b plan

You should always seek the services of an attorney, accountant, or other qualified professional when preparing a will, trust, or estate plan. They will be able to help you determine the gift method that will maximize the benefits for both you and the beneficiary of your gift.

### Giving to Charity: Tax Planning with Qualified Charitable Distributions

Are you at least age 72 and subject to Required Minimum Distributions (RMD) from your IRA?

Do you have Charitable Intentions for the required distribution?

### Then you may consider the use of a qualified charitable distribution!

Qualified Charitable Distributions were made permanent in 2015 when Congress passed the Protecting Americans from Tax Hikes (PATH) Act. The IRA owner subject to required minimum distributions can donate up to \$100,000 directly from an IRA to a charity without getting taxed on the distribution.

Donating IRA funds directly to qualified charities allows the IRA holder or beneficiary to avoid taking possession of the funds and *the tax bill that comes with it*.

**Another benefit** of the RMD payment applied to a Qualified Charitable Distribution is the amount is **excluded from tax formulas** that could impact multiple categories such as Social Security taxation, Medicare Part B and D premium increases, and the Medicare tax on investment income.

### **HOW IT WORKS**

The Qualified Charitable Distribution must be paid <u>directly from the IRA</u> to a qualified 501(c)(3) institution eligible to receive tax-deductible contributions, like St. James Catholic Church and many other public charities. The charitable entity, as the recipient of the Qualified Charitable Distribution, must receive the donation by December 31<sup>st</sup> in order to ensure credit to the proper year. It is that simple!


