**Ash Wednesday (February 22, 2023) and Good Friday (April 7, 2023)** are obligatory days of *fasting and abstinence* for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of *abstinence*.

The norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal.

The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily his Resurrection.

### Self-Sacrificing Love

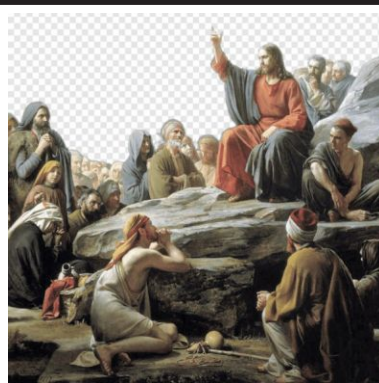
Pope Benedict XVI's encyclical ["God is Love"](#) teaches that "agape, which [is]...the typical expression for the biblical notion of love....expresses the experience of a love which involves a real discovery of the other, moving beyond the selfish character that prevailed earlier. Love now becomes concern and care for the other. No longer is it self-seeking, a sinking in the intoxication of happiness; instead it seeks the good of the beloved: it becomes renunciation and it is ready, and even willing, for sacrifice" (n. 6).

This kind of love is seen in a particular way when we care for the weak and defenseless, both born and unborn. May the Pope's encyclical encourage us to build a culture of life!

The Lord Jesus makes universal the commandment of love. The Father's "sun rises on the bad and the good, he rains on the just and the unjust." So Christians are not to draw false boundaries to their love. Christ, after all, now has full authority in heaven and on earth. He has embraced and redeemed the entire universe, and has given us a share in his dominion and in his power to love. "All these are yours, and you are Christ's and Christ is God's," Paul tells us in the Second Reading. So loving everybody comes with the territory.

One of the false distinctions, therefore, is between born and unborn. There can be no difference in our love. The size or age or level of dependency of a child cannot exempt us from loving and caring for the life of that child. Nor can it exempt us from recognizing the personhood of that child in the law. "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." This does not simply mean we love our neighbor in the way or to the extent that we love ourselves. It means we love our neighbor as a person like ourselves. We recognize that whatever differences there may be between ourselves and our neighbors, they still have the same human dignity that we share. We are to see through all the differences, recognize that common dignity, and love them as a person like ourselves. ~ *Priests for Life*

### Health & Wellness Committee Article

The religious discipline of fasting is mentioned more than 70 times in the Old and New Testament. Fasting, accompanied by prayer, was used to honor God, to show sorrow or remorse over sin or to pursue answers from God.

The Church has promulgated this discipline through the ages. The Law of Fasting required no more than one meal and two smaller meals not equal to one. The Law of Abstinence required refraining from meat and meat products. Historically, fast and abstinence days included all Fridays of the year, the weekdays of Lent, and Holy Saturday before noon, Ember days (Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday 4x a year) and the vigils of Pentecost, Assumption, All Saints and Christmas. A Eucharistic fast has been in place since the 3rd century, previously requiring fasting from midnight until reception of Holy Communion.

In 1966, Pope Paul VI issued a document, *Paenitemini*, requiring fasting (for ages 18-59) and abstinence (ages 14+) for Ash Wednesday and Good Friday and abstinence for the Fridays of Lent and emphasized an inner spirit of conversion with voluntary acts of penance on the remaining Fridays. The Eucharistic fast was also changed and eventually reduced to one hour before reception of Holy Communion.

Voluntary fasting is not a uniquely religious practice. The ancient Greek physicians prescribed "instead of medicine, fast a day." Mark Twain proposed, "the average sick man can best be treated with total abstention from food for one or two days." Most have heard of the adage, "feed a cold, starve a fever." Medical studies on the use of fasting for chronic disease began in the early 1900's. More recently there is a renewed interest in the benefits of fasting to improve weight, diabetes, cardiovascular health, autoimmune and neurological disease and alter gut bacteria. Intermittent Fasting (IF) has been found to trigger changes in the body to allow cells time to reset, clean house and adapt to stress. (IF) allows the circadian clock network to harmonize. (IF) includes Time Restricted Feeding (TRF) and Alternate day fasting (ADF). (TRF) would allow a window for eating, usually eight hours followed by a fast. (ADF) usually involves a schedule of 5 days of regular caloric intake with 2 days of fasting per week. Alternate day modified fasting (ADMF) follows the 5:2 schedule with a light meal allowed (~25% of usual intake) on fasting days. The Church Law of Fasting is most like the ADMF while the Eucharistic fast of old could be consistent with (TRF). \*(IF) as a treatment for chronic disease should be done in consult with a primary care provider.

## LITURGICALLY LIVING THIS LENTEN SEASON

- Make Lenten sacrifices in prayer, fasting, and almsgiving.
- Go to confession!!!
- Pray Lenten devotionals together each day as a family.
- Pick a neighbor, family member, or friend to "adopt" this Lent. Bring them a meal or do something nice for them.
- Pray the Stations of the Cross on Fridays either at home or with the parish.
- Encourage better attention during Mass by assigning each member of the family one reading to pay special attention to (First Reading, Psalm, Second Reading, and the Gospel). Have everyone give a re-cap of "their" reading on the way home in the car. Have a family discussion and allow everyone to share what they noticed.
- Set up a Lenten home altar with a crucifix, purple cloth, a crown of thorns, a Bible, and the Stations!
- Make a sacrifice jar: Each day at breakfast, each person will draw a slip of paper that has a sacrifice on it.
