PARISH LIFE



"The toleration and promotion of abortion, socially and legally, has clouded individual consciences and made it difficult for many to distinguish between good and evil, even when what is at stake is the fundamental right to life. If we reject the value and dignity of human life, our culture becomes more and more based on a lie and its structures

cannot long endure." (Bishop Michael W. Warfel)

"You will show me the path to life." This line from to-day's responsorial psalm sums up the message of this liturgy and of the Easter season. Christ Jesus, risen from the dead, fills his people with the same life, and this becomes a path, a way of life. Hence, Peter can say in the second reading, "You were ransomed from your futile conduct."

The journey of the disciples on the road to Emmaus, of course, symbolizes this "path of life" and the new way in which we are called to walk. Along this way, and amidst the challenges of life, we can be tempted, as they were, to "look downcast" and simply discuss how "we were hoping" that things would be better. By giving death more credit than it deserves, we can fail to recognize that Jesus is walking with us through the most difficult hours.

This is especially true in a "culture of death," when those most difficult hours can tempt people to resort to abortion or euthanasia. Christ, risen from the dead, walks with us and dines with us. He rescues us from the "futile conduct" of turning to death as a solution to our problems, because now, the kingdom of death has been conquered. Embracing life-giving repentance, we are now filled with the Holy Spirit, whom the risen Christ sends upon us, as the first reading declares. That Spirit not only purifies us, but enables us to announce the Gospel of Life and to become advocates for all our brothers and sisters, just as the Holy Spirit is an advocate for us.

Aleluya, aleluya.

Señor Jesús, haz que comprendamos la Sagrada Escritura. Enciende nuestro corazón mientras nos hablas.

En la conversación de los discípulos con el peregrino desconocido impresiona la expresión que el

evangelista san Lucas pone en los labios de uno de ellos: «Nosotros esperábamos...» (Lc 24, 21). Este verbo en pasado lo dice todo: Hemos creído, hemos seguido, hemos esperado..., pero ahora todo ha terminado. También Jesús de Nazaret, que se había manifestado como un profeta poderoso en obras y palabras, ha fracasado, y nosotros estamos decepcionados. Este drama de los discípulos de Emaús es como un espejo de la situación de muchos cristianos de nuestro tiempo. Al parecer, la esperanza de la fe ha fracasado. La fe misma entra en crisis a causa de experiencias negativas que nos llevan a sentirnos abandonados por el Señor. Pero este camino hacia Emaús, por el que avanzamos, puede llegar a ser el camino de una purificación y maduración de nuestra fe en Dios. 🛚 También hoy podemos entrar en diálogo con Jesús escuchando su palabra. También hoy, él parte el pan para nosotros y se entrega a sí mismo como nuestro pan. Así, el encuentro con Cristo resucitado, que es posible también hoy, nos da una fe más profunda y auténtica, templada, por decirlo así, por el fuego del acontecimiento pascual; una fe sólida, porque no se alimenta de ideas humanas, sino de la palabra de Dios y de su presencia real en la Eucaristía. Los discípulos de Emaús, cuando caminaban con sus dudas y bajo la tentación del desánimo, escucharon las palabras consoladoras de Jesús. Cristo les hizo ver que, en muchas ocasiones, sus caminos no son los nuestros. Por eso, es necesario vivir con una fe profunda y luminosa que nos lleve a la aceptación amorosa de la voluntad de Dios en nuestra vida. Justamente en la Eucaristía encontramos el consuelo y la fuerza para seguir luchando aún en medio de las dificultades y contrariedades de la vida.

THE WAY OF SAINT IAMES (CAMINO DE SANTIAGO)

THE WAY OF SAINT JAMES is a pilgrim walk to Santiago de Compostela (St James of Compostela Cathedral) in Galicia, Spain. It was established in the 9th Century after the discovery of the body of St James the Apostle was found in a field there by a shepherd. King Alfonso II had a small chapel built after being informed about this amazing discovery. Over time larger churches were built to house the relics of St James. The rest is history, as thousands of pilgrims make their way to visit the relics of St James by walking the different routes of the Camino De Santiago.

The St James Health and Wellness Committee would like to offer the opportunity for St James Parish to experience THE WAY OF ST JAMES or THE CAMINO DE SANTIAGO by mimicking the process here in Elizabethtown. Research shows that walking has many healthy benefits such as reducing the risk of high blood pressure, high cholesterol, diabetes, heart disease, and helps with weight loss. Let's get healthy while devoting our walking time to our Patron Saint, St James the Greater!

HOW WILL IT WORK?

Pick a route from the Camino Route List. (OK to pick a quarter or a half route or less). Begin your walk on APRIL 25TH and end on JULY 25TH, **FEAST DAY OF ST JAMES THE GREATER.** Walk your own pace, on your own or with a group. Keep track of your miles. Celebrate our walking accomplishments at a gathering after July 25th.

The Archdiocese Returns to Distribution of the Precious Blood at Communion

Archbishop Shelton Fabre has announced that the Archdiocese will reinstate permission to distribute the Precious Blood to the faithful from the Chalice at weekend Masses on the Feast of Corpus Christi, June 10-11, 2023. Since 1978, the Bishops of the United States have encouraged the distribution of the Precious Blood regularly, noting that this "is the fullest sign and most perfect fulfillment of what the Lord did and directed." As always, reception from the Chalice is optional and those who are ill, infirm, or have compromised immune systems should be reassured that our Church also teaches that Jesus Christ is truly and wholly present under both species of bread and wine. Our parish and the Archdiocese, especially through *The Record* newspaper, will be using this opportunity to provide you with renewed catechesis on the precious gift of Jesus Christ that we have been given in the Holy Eucharist.


