Mercy Triumphs

The Church opposes abortion, but embraces with mercy those who have made this mistake. Let's all take encouragement from these words of Pope John Paul II: "I would now like to say a special word to women who have had an abortion. The Church is aware of the many factors which may have influenced your decision, and she does not doubt that in many cases it was a painful and even shattering decision. The wound in your heart may not yet have healed. Certainly what happened was and remains terribly wrong. But do not give in to discouragement and do not lose hope. Try rather to understand what happened and face it honestly. If you have not already done so, give yourselves over with humility and trust to repentance. The Father of mercies is ready to give you his forgiveness and his peace in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. To the same Father and to his mercy you can with sure hope entrust your child." (The Gospel of Life, #99).

The First Reading and Gospel passage assigned to this Sunday talk about the vineyard of the Lord, and the fact that those to whom the vineyard was entrusted did not properly respond to the Lord or yield the fruit for which he was looking. Instead, they broke his covenant, killed his prophets and eventually his Son, and had the vineyard taken away from them.

The vineyard we have here in the United States, in particular, entrusts us with profound gifts of freedom. We can shape our own culture and government. God asks us to bear fruits of life rather than to abuse our freedom with perversions of "choice" that end up taking life. ~ *Priests for Life* ~

XXVII Domingo Ordinario

Yo los he elegido del mundo, dice el Señor,

para que vayan y den fruto, y su fruto permanezca La historia de amor entre Dios y su pueblo parece

La historia de amor entre Dios y su pueblo parece ser una historia de fracasos, como sucede en la parábola de los labradores asesinos, que aparece como el fracaso del sueño de Dios.



Hay un hombre que construye una viña y están los labradores que matan a todos los que envía el señor. Pero es precisamente de esos muertos que todo toma vida. Los profetas, los hombres de Dios que han hablado al pueblo, que no fueron escuchados, que fueron descartados, serán su gloria. El Hijo, el último enviado, que fue precisamente descartado por eso, juzgado, no escuchado y asesinado, se convirtió en piedra angular.

Esta historia que parece ser una historia de amor, después parece terminar en una historia de fracasos, pero que termina con el gran don de Dios, que del descarte saca la salvación; de su Hijo descartado nos salva a todos. Es aquí donde la lógica del fracaso se cae. Y Jesús lo recuerda a los jefes del pueblo, citando la Escritura: La piedra que descartaron los constructores es ahora piedra angular. Esto lo ha hecho el Señor y es una maravilla a nuestros ojos.

El camino de nuestra redención es un camino de muchos fracasos. También el último, el de la cruz, es un escándalo. Pero precisamente ahí vence el amor. Y esa historia que comienza con un sueño de amor y continúa con una historia de fracasos, termina en la victoria del amor: la cruz de Jesús. No debemos olvidar este camino, es un camino difícil.

Si cada uno de nosotros hace un examen de conciencia, verá cuántas veces ha expulsado a los profetas. Cuántas veces ha dicho a Jesús 'vete', cuántas veces ha querido salvarse a sí mismo, cuántas veces hemos pensado que nosotros éramos los justos. (Cf Homilía de S.S. Francisco, 1 de junio de 2015, en Santa Marta).

En nuestra sociedad, hay un creciente pensamiento de que la felicidad se encuentra en olvidarse de los problemas de nuestra vida y vivir como si no existieran. La felicidad en los tiempos modernos, se resume en placeres, amor propio, independencia. Pensemos en que el primer pecado de Adán y Eva fue el placer y el querer ser independientes. El querer ser como Dios.

Abramos nuestro corazón para reflexionar y alzar nuestra mirada en Jesucristo Crucificado. Jesucristo sabe que las soluciones que el mundo nos ofrece no son las más acertadas. Él quiere ayudarnos y para eso nos pide que creamos en él y que nos aferremos a Él como un hijo se aferra en la cintura de su padre cuando siente temor. Sepamos poner todas nuestras preocupaciones en sus manos y a vivir nuestra vida dándonos a nuestros seres queridos. Cumpliendo con nuestros deberes habituales, para que nuestra vida sea plena.



Searching for Land

Common Earth Gardens began in 2007 as the Refugee Agriculture Partnership Program (RAPP). The 7th Street Community Garden and the Southside Community Garden were established as refugee agricultural sites, providing the opportunity to grow culturally familiar foods to new Americans – many of whom were living in apartments for the first time. Over time, the program expanded to several more garden sites. Today gardeners grow hundreds of thousands of dollars' worth of fresh produce for themselves, family, and friends: each plot feeds 11 people, on average! And nearly 90% of gardeners say it makes a difference in their food security.

Catholic Charities of Louisville added programming to include farmers market promotion, and an incubator farm for gardeners who want to engage the commercial food system. Catholic Charities has partnered with several farm sites to bring incubator farmers into larger scale production. 


The Maranatha Retreat is a day-long event that uses the teachings of St. Ignatius to reignite the sense of




