PARISH LIFE

Does the child conceived in the loving act of their parents and the child conceived by an act of sexual violence have the same value and dignity?

And, does that child - that person - deserve to be put to death for a crime they did not commit?"



On May 7, 2005, Pope Benedict XVI said the following in a homily in Rome: "The freedom to kill is not true freedom, but a tyranny that reduces the human being to slavery."

In our day, some try to justify the killing of the unborn by appealing to "freedom of choice." Tragically, however, women getting abortions feel that they have no freedom and no choice. They feel trapped, and this is why the pro-life movement provides alternatives to abortion. Moreover, this "freedom to kill" leaves no freedom or choice for the child who is killed. Freedom is not the ability to do whatever we want; freedom is the power to do what is right, to always respect the truth and to choose life.

The first reading from Malachi asks, "Have we not all one Father? Has not the one God created us?" This theme is echoed in the Gospel's teaching, "Call no one on earth your father; you have but one Father in heaven."

In a culture of death, the worldview is that we are responsible only for those for whom we choose to be responsible, and that this choice is a purely individual, private matter. Such a culture would have us believe that someone's decision to abort a child is "none of our business."

But if we all have one Father, then that makes us brothers and sisters, and means that our lives are entrusted to one another's care. We are responsible for each other before we choose to be. The abortions that others have are our business, because those children – as well as their parents — are also entrusted to our care, in the one family of God. Ours is the business of love, to care as much as we can for all our brothers and sisters.

PARISH LIFE

XXXI Sunday in Ordinary Time

Week 31 of Ordinary Time brings us closer to the close of the Liturgical Year, to give way to the new Liturgical Year, which begins with Advent and prepares us for Christmas. In this closing, the Liturgy proposes an itinerary, a path, that helps us deepen our authenticity.

The gospel of Matthew (23:1-12) invites us to begin this path of authenticity with a thorough review of our way of acting, so that we can prepare to eradicate all types of hypocrisy from our lives.

Bluntly, this gospel is a very serious criticism of religious experts and those who have some kind of power over people, when they act with hypocrisy. Jesus will tell us: "do everything they say, but do not imitate their actions, because they say one thing and do another."

For Jesus, the hypocrisy of those who have power, any type of power, is manifested in these five aspects: 1) Putting heavy burdens on people. 2) Act so that people see it. 3) Twist the law and thereby twist the truth. 4) Seek to be the first. 5) Feeling superior to others.


Jesus will also tell us that the only thing that can eradicate this hypocrisy is a life as brothers. But not a conventional brotherhood. But one that is built on the basis of mercy, simplicity, authentic justice, closeness and encounter, and on the basis of humility. A brotherhood that is not to protect me or take care of me, but to protect and take care of us all, protected by mutual respect, valuation and appreciation.

Whoever humble themselves will be exalted.

He who presents himself to others as he is and without posturing; he who does not have to hide his gifts and his fears, his frailties and strengths, his limitations and possibilities, his errors and successes, is a real person. If you want to root out the hypocrisy that kills the soul, do not feel superior to anyone but equal, do not consider yourself the owner of anything but co-responsible with others and, most importantly, become a servant of everyone in all circumstances, time and place. And you will see how your joy begins to emerge, revealing the life

you carry inside.

XXXI Domingo Ordinario



Semana 31 del Tiempo Ordinario nos acerca al cierre del Año Litúrgico, para dar paso al nuevo Año Litúrgico, que comienza con el Adviento y nos prepara a la Navidad. En este cierre, la Liturgia nos propone un itinerario, un camino, que nos ayude a profundizar en nuestra autenticidad.

El evangelio de Mateo (23,1-12) nos invita a comenzar este camino de autenticidad con una revisión a fondo de nuestro modo de actuación, para que así nos dispongamos a erradicar de nuestras vidas todo tipo de hipocresía.

Sin rodeos, este evangelio es una crítica muy seria a los expertos en religión y a los que tienen algún tipo de poder sobre las personas, cuando actúan con hipocresía. Jesús nos dirá: "hagan todo lo que ellos dicen, pero no imiten su actuación, porque dicen una cosa y hacen otra"

Para Jesús, la hipocresía de quien tiene poder, cualquier tipo de poder, se manifiesta en estos cinco aspectos: 1) Poner cargas pesadas sobre las personas. 2) Actuar para que lo vea la gente. 3) Torcer la ley y con ello torcer la verdad. 4) Buscar ser los primeros. 5) Sentirse superior a los demás.

También nos dirá Jesús, que lo único que puede erradicar esta hipocresía es una vida de hermanos. Pero no una hermandad convencional. Sino aquella que es construida a base de misericordia, de sencillez, de auténtica justicia, de cercanía y encuentro, y a base de humildad. Una hermandad que no sea para arroparme o cuidarme yo, sino para arroparnos y cuidarnos todos al abrigo del respeto, valoración y aprecio recíprocos.

Quien se presenta ante los demás tal cual es y sin posturas. Quien no tiene que ocultar sus dones y sus miedos, sus fragilidades y fortalezas, sus limitaciones y posibilidades, sus errores y aciertos, es una persona de verdad.

Si quieres arrancar de raíz la hipocresía que mata el alma, no te sientas superior a nadie sino igual, no te consideres el dueño de nada sino corresponsable con los demás y, lo más importante, hazte servidor de todos en toda circunstancia, tiempo y lugar. Y verás cómo empieza a brotar tu alegría, dejando al descubierto la vida que llevas dentro.






