Be vigilant at all times

LUKE 21:36

The beginning of the Advent season focuses our attention on the future coming of Christ in glory, and echoes a theme of repentance as a preparation for that coming. Christ's coming ushers in the final triumph of life over death. The preparation for that coming, therefore, includes repentance from the works of death, including abortion. Not only individuals but nations likewise need to repent.

When we battle against the Culture of Death in its various forms, we may often pray as in today's First Reading, "Lord, rend the heavens and come down!" Why, for example, does the Lord just not appear from the sky to stop the abortions from happening? The fact is that he did come down in the Incarnation of Jesus Christ, and through the Lord's clear teachings continues to put the truth in our minds, and the grace in our hearts, so that we can be the ones who bear witness to life amid the Culture of Death, work tirelessly to transform that culture, and intervene to save the helpless. ~ *Priests for Life*.

Primer Domingo de Adviento

Dentro de este marco del año litúrgico, el Adviento se presenta como un prelude introductorio del misterio de la venida del Hijo de Dios a nuestra historia humana, un prelude de la Navidad. Estamos tan acostumbrados a celebrarlo que ya no nos sorprende. Y, sin embargo, ese misterio ha supuesto una novedad tan radical que sólo podremos vivirlo con provecho si nos preparamos cuidadosamente para esa celebración. Es decir, si, por un lado, nos vemos necesitados de esa venida, si aceptamos que sólo gracias a ella podemos encontrar un camino cierto de felicidad; y si, por otro, nos dejamos enseñar por la Palabra de Dios, que nos instruye para que sepamos acoger la liberación que nos había prometido. El apóstol Pablo nos recuerda como Dios nos ha concedido los dones divinos por medio de Cristo Jesús, ya que por él nos ha enriquecido con abundancia en todo lo que se refiere a la palabra y al conocimiento. Los que esperamos la manifestación de nuestro Señor Jesucristo. Él nos hará permanecer irreprochables hasta el fin, hasta el día de su advenimiento. Dios es quien nos ha llamado a la unión con su Hijo Jesucristo, y Dios es fiel. Qué tiempo tan apto el del Adviento para penetrar en la grandeza y trascendencia de la vocación cristiana, porque ella se desprende del misterio de la Encarnación! Dios en su decisión amorosa de salvar al hombre quiere hacerse uno de nosotros; más se entrega al servicio del hombre: siendo Dios se anonadó a sí mismo haciéndose siervo, en todo, menos en el pecado, semejante al hombre, ante este ejemplo ¿quién no se va a enamorar de Cristo? A entregarse a Él completamente, quien dió la vida en la dura pero sublime tarea de la Redención.

First Sunday of Advent

Within this framework of the liturgical year, Advent is presented as an introductory prelude to the mystery of the coming of the Son of God to our human history, a prelude to Christmas. We are so used to celebrating it that it no longer surprises us. And yet, this mystery represents such a radical novelty that we can only experience it profitably if we prepare carefully for that celebration. That is, if, on the one hand, we see ourselves in need of that coming, if we accept that only thanks to it we can find a certain path to happiness; and if, on the other hand, we allow ourselves to be taught by the Word of God, which instructs us so that we know how to accept the liberation that He had promised us.

The apostle Paul reminds us how God has granted us divine gifts through Christ Jesus, since through him he has enriched us with abundance in everything that refers to word and knowledge. Those of us who wait for the manifestation of our Lord Jesus Christ, He will make us remain blameless until the end, until the day of his advent. God is the one who has called us to union with his Son Jesus Christ, and God is faithful.

What a suitable time of Advent to penetrate the greatness and transcendence of the Christian vocation, because it emerges from the mystery of the Incarnation! God in his loving decision to save man wants to become one of us; The more he gives himself to the service of man: being God, he emptied himself by becoming a servant, and in everything, except sin, similar to man. In the face of this example, who would not fall in love with Christ? To give of oneself to Him, who spent His life in the hard but sublime task of Redemption.

What is Advent?

A season of **hope, preparation, EXPECTATION & celebration**



The **ADVENT WREATH** is a popular symbol used as the focus of prayer throughout the season

Advent is made up of **four weeks**, divided into **two periods**:

1 First Sunday of Advent until December 16

focus: Christ's second coming at the end of time

2 December 17 to 24
focus: Preparation for celebrating the birth of Jesus Christ

The **first Sunday of Advent** marks the beginning of the liturgical year



"Advent" (Latin) MEANS "a coming or arrival"

Advent is more than the preparation for Christ's birth. It also celebrates the **three-fold coming of the Lord**:

- **Remembering** the events that surrounded the Lord's coming long ago
- **Celebrating** his coming among us today
- **Looking forward** to his final coming in glory

Through prayer, spiritual reading, acts of charity, and participation in Eucharist, Advent helps us to expand the meaning of our lives, so that we are not ends in ourselves, but a people who seek Christ as our hopeful end and joyful fulfillment



Our prayer at Advent is one of hope and love:

Come, Lord Jesus!

ALL ABOUT THE Advent Wreath

Usually made up of evergreen branches or boughs placed in a circle, topped with four candles

Used as a prayerful way to reflect the passage of the Advent season

The wreath is blessed and one candle is lit on the first Sunday of Advent; another candle is lit every Sunday until all four candles are burning brightly

The **EVERGREENS** remind us of the everlasting life promised to us by the gift of Jesus Christ, who came among us to save us from sin and death

PURPLE CANDLES symbolize our waiting, hoping, longing expectation for the arrival of Christ

A **PINK CANDLE** for the third Sunday reminds us that the time of Christ's arrival is fast approaching and we must prepare

The act of **LIGHTING THE CANDLES** banishes the darkness: a reminder of Jesus Christ, the Light who has come into the world through his birth, and who continues to shine brightly through his Church

Advent Symbols

AND WHAT THEY MEAN



The evergreen circle and four candles of the **ADVENT WREATH** reflect the passage of the Advent season. It is often blessed at the beginning of Mass on the first Sunday of Advent.

Although not a season of penance, **RECONCILIATION** finds a special place in Advent as we prepare for Christmas and seek to approach Jesus' coming with hearts free of sin and filled with praise.

"If you have something dark in your soul, ask the Lord for forgiveness. Christmas is a great opportunity to cleanse the soul!"

POPE FRANCIS

Advent is a time of **LONGING AND WAITING** for the Lord to come. Premature decoration of the church building and early use of Christmas songs at liturgy compromise the spirit of expectation.



VIOLET VESTMENTS reflect longing and anticipation, not penance. **Rose vestments** may be used on the third (Gaudete) Sunday to signal the mid-point of the season.

The **GLORY TO GOD** is not sung and the organ and other musical instruments are used in moderation to allow us to anticipate the full joy of December 25th, when they are taken up again. Flowers may be used, but in moderation so as to leave a sense of abundance for the Nativity.



ALLELUIA continues to be sung in the Gospel Acclamation and in other songs. This is the clearest indication that Advent is a season of expectation, not penance.

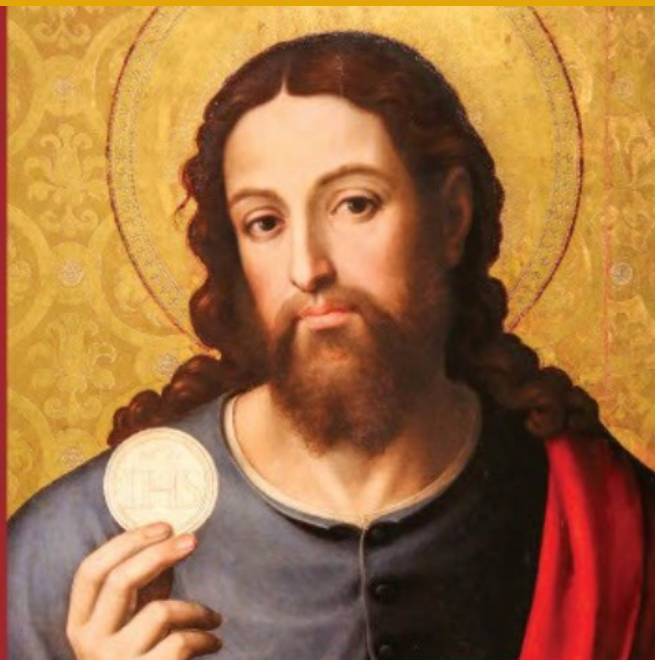

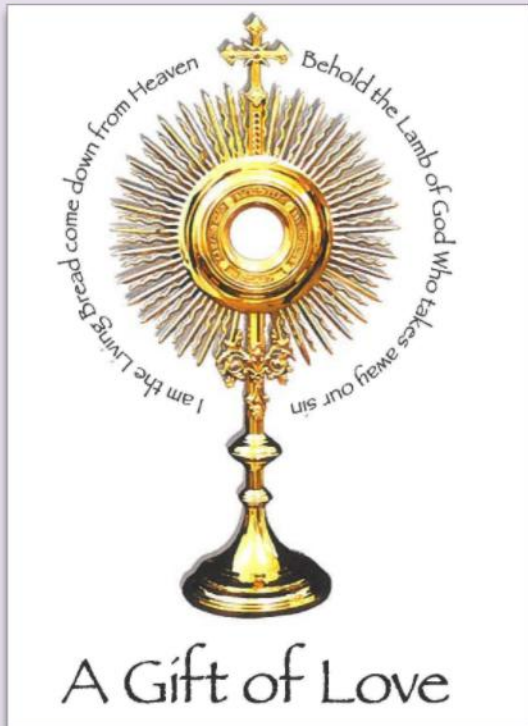

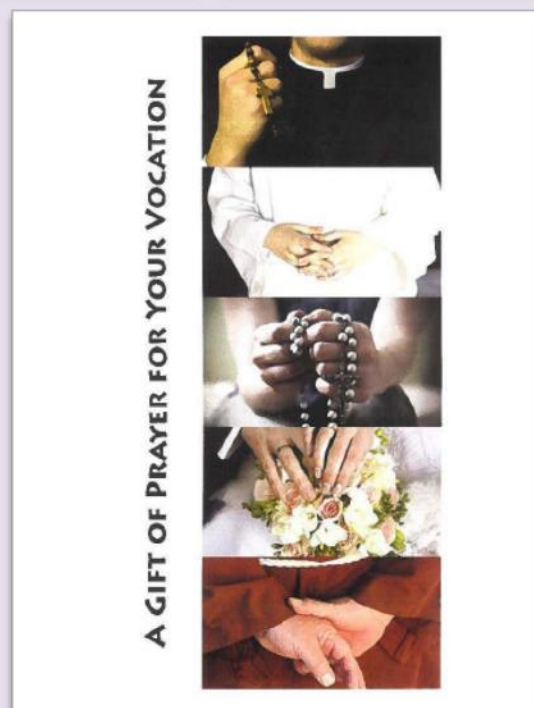

The cards are at no charge. All you must do is spend one hour in prayer before the Eucharist during Adoration.



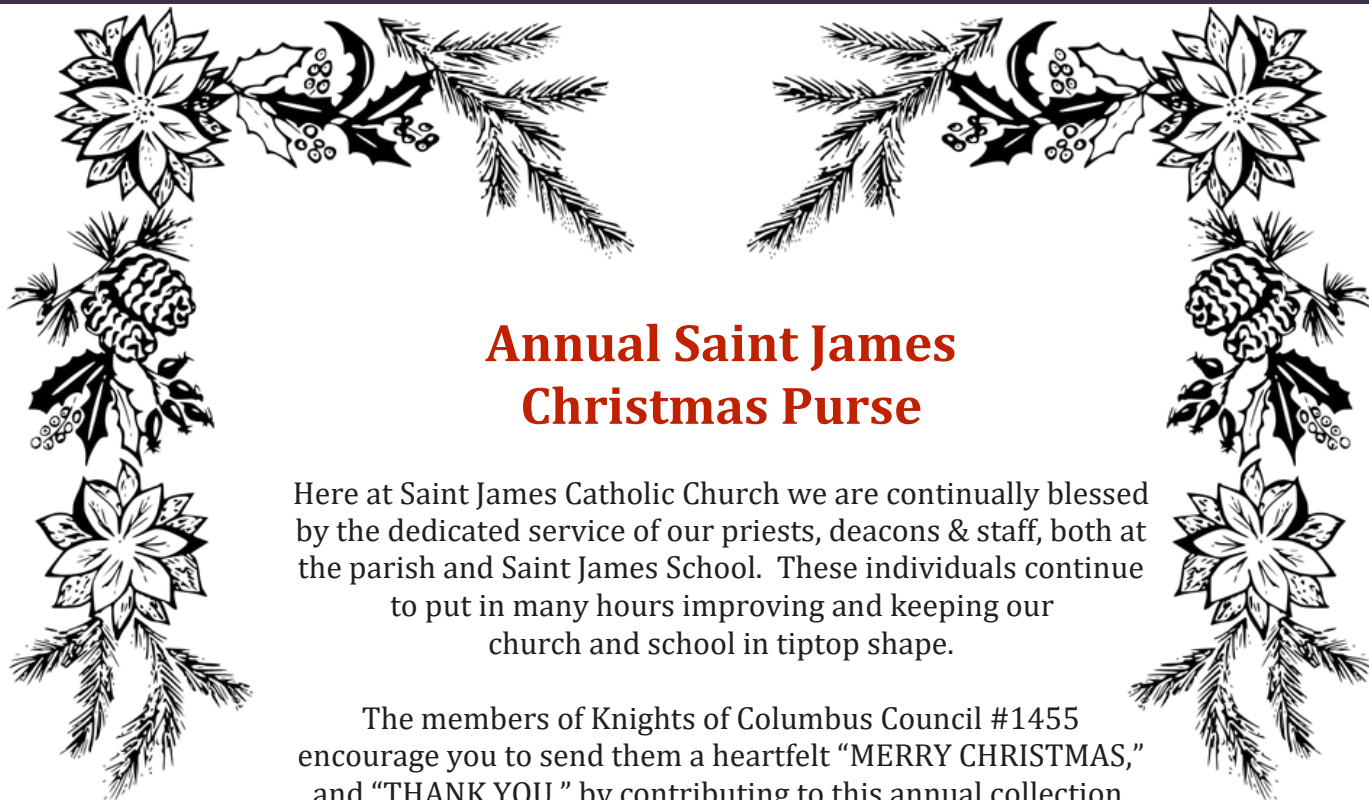
