





### PARISH LIFE

### "I do will it. Be made clean."

Jesus healed the lepers, who were outcasts to their community, as the first reading makes clear. The healing demonstrates two key lessons that relate to the Church's stand on life.

First, Jesus is always on the side of human life. His healing of some represents his liberation of all from the power of sin and death. Ultimately, the healings described in the Gospels point to the overthrow of the entire kingdom of death, and the final triumph of life. Christ is life, and to stand with him is to stand with life and against whatever destroys it.

Second, the Lord always broke down false barriers between different classes of human beings. He saw their humanity, and the image of God inscribed on them from creation. This image is not obscured by the false distinctions people make by their prejudice or by the customs that deny the equal dignity of all people. The Lord's determination to eliminate false barriers is seen in many other ways in the Gospels. We see Him reach out to children despite the efforts of the apostles to keep them away (Matthew 19:13-15); to tax collectors and sinners despite the objections of the Scribes (Mark 2:16); to the blind despite the warnings of the crowd (Matthew 20:29-34); to a foreign woman despite the utter surprise of the disciples and of the woman herself (John 4:9, 27); to Gentiles despite the anger of the Jews (Matthew 21:41-46); and to the lepers, despite their isolation from the rest of society (Luke 17:11-19).

When it comes to human dignity, Christ erases distinctions. St. Paul declares, "There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave or free person, there is not male and female; for you are all one in Christ Jesus" (Galatians 3:28).

We can likewise say, "There is neither born nor unborn." Using this distinction as a basis for the value of life or the protection one deserves is meaningless and offensive to all that Scripture teaches. The unborn are the segment of our society which is most neglected and discriminated against. Christ Himself surely has a special love for them.

**ATTENTION MALE PARISHIONERS!** Our parish is blessed to have four active priests serving at Saint James Catholic Church (Father Michael, Father Loi, Father Chuck and Father Francisco). **The Fasting Brothers Ministry is seeking men to join our ministry.** A minimum of six men per priest is needed (at least 24). Each fasting brother offers some form of fasting as a way of praying for the needs and intentions of one of our priests on a specific day each week. Each man prayerfully discerns the type of unique fasting he will offer and commits to doing the specific fasting on a designated day of the week (except Sundays/Solemnities). Fasting examples include fasting from food or drink or refraining from social media or radio/TV on the assigned day. Please consider supporting our priests by joining our ministry.

## LITURGICALLY LIVING THIS LENTEN SEASON

- · Make Lenten sacrifices in prayer, fasting, and almsgiving.
- Go to confession!!!
- · Pray Lenten devotionals together each day as a family.
- Pick a neighbor, family member, or friend to "adopt" this Lent.
   Bring them a meal or do something nice for them.
- Pray the Stations of the Cross on Fridays either at home or with the parish.
- Encourage better attention during Mass by assigning each member of the family one reading to pay special attention to (First Reading, Psalm, Second Reading, and the Gospel). Have everyone give a re-cap of "their" reading on the way home in the car. Have a family discussion and allow everyone to share what they noticed.
- Set up a Lenten home altar with a crucifix, purple cloth, a crown of thorns, a Bible, and the Stations!
- Make a sacrifice jar: Each day at breakfast, each person will draw a slip of paper that has a sacrifice on it.

### Sexto Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario Pablo, ¿una persona complaciente?

La semana pasada escuchamos a San Pablo decir que se había hecho todo a todos. Esta semana escuchamos que intentó dar gusto a todos. Para los oídos modernos, esto suena más a un vendedor de autos usados, que tiene una oferta apropiada para cualquier comprador. Pero eso no era lo que Pablo quería decir. La clave del estilo de vida de Pablo es la última línea de la segunda lectura: "Sean, pues, imitadores míos, como yo lo soy de Cristo". (1 Corintios 11,1)

¿Recuerdas cuando Pablo todavía era Saulo, el judío que perseguía a los cristianos? Cuando le cayó un rayo, no escuchó un trueno, sino la voz de Jesús, que le preguntó por qué Saulo lo perseguía. Más tarde, Pablo comenzó a comprender que todos los cristianos constituyen el cuerpo de Cristo. Como miembros de ese cuerpo, podemos mostrar a otros cómo es Jesús con nuestro ejemplo. Parece ser un proceso de dos partes.

Primero, para mostrar a Cristo, tenemos que conocer a Cristo. Podemos hacerlo leyendo las Escrituras y orando con ellas. Podemos recibir los sacramentos con regularidad, especialmente la Reconciliación, donde experimentamos su perdón y su amor, y la Eucaristía, donde Jesús se une a nosotros, para que podamos llegar a ser más como él.

La segunda parte es actuar como Jesús. Si queremos que la gente vea a Cristo en nosotros, no tenemos que vestirnos como él ni dejarnos crecer la barba. Tenemos que hacer las cosas como las haría Jesús: perdonar a las personas que nos lastiman, cuidar a los enfermos, a los moribundos, a los pobres. No tengas miedo de contarle a la gente lo que Dios ha hecho por ti. Anima a otros a estar agradecidos por lo que Dios ha hecho por ellos. Reza con personas que tienen dificultades hablando con Dios.

Obviamente, Pablo no agradó a todos porque así no hubiera terminado su vida en la prisión. Estaba más interesado en agradar a Dios difundiendo la Buena Nueva de la resurrección de Jesús. Si podemos imitar a Pablo de esa manera, no saldremos del camino correcto. *Tom Schmidt*

### Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time Paul the People Pleaser?

Last week we heard St. Paul saying that he was all things to all people. This week, we hear that he tried to please everyone. To modern ears, that sounds more like a used car salesman, who has just the right deal for any buyer. But that wasn't what Paul meant. The key to Paul's way of life is the last line of the second reading: "Be imitators of me, as I am of Christ." (1 Cor 11:1)

Remember when Paul was still Saul, the Jew who persecuted Christians? When he was struck by lightning he heard, not thunder, but the voice of Jesus, who asked why Saul was persecuting him. Paul later began to understand that all Christians make up the body of Christ. As members of that body, we can show others what Jesus is like, by our example. That seems to be a two part process.

First, to show Christ, we have to know Christ. We can do that by reading the scriptures and praying with them. We can receive the sacraments regularly, especially Reconciliation, where we experience his forgiveness and love, and the Eucharist, where Jesus unites himself with us, so that we can become more like him.

The second part is acting like Jesus. If we want people to see Christ in us, we don't dress like him, or grow a beard. We have to do things as Jesus would: Forgive people who hurt us, care for the sick, the dying, the poor. Don't be afraid to tell people what God has done for you; encourage others to be grateful for what God has done for them. Pray with people who have difficulty talking to God.

Paul obviously didn't please everyone, or he wouldn't have ended his life in prison. He was more interested in pleasing God by spreading the Good News of Jesus' resurrection. If we can imitate Paul in that way, we can't go wrong. *Tom Schmidt*






