



Tercer Domingo de Cuaresma



Como ya han pasado unas semanas de la Cuaresma, podemos echar un vistazo a lo que significa alejarse del pecado y ser fiel al Evangelio. Un buen lugar para empezar serían los Diez Mandamientos. La lectura del Éxodo nos

presenta una de las primeras listas de los Mandamientos. En este pasaje, Dios explica algunas leyes para mostrar cuán serias son. En el primero, Dios incluye hacer imágenes para adorarlas. Ahora, se podría llegar a la conclusión de que todas las estatuas y crucifijos dentro de las iglesias deben ser destruidos. No es así.

En los días de Moisés, la gente de otras culturas hacía imágenes de sus dioses y declaraba que esa imagen era el dios y debería ser adorada. El Señor quería que su pueblo se acordara que Dios no puede limitarse a una imagen o una idea. Eso sigue siendo cierto hoy en día. Las imágenes y estatuas están hechas para ayudarnos a orar a Dios, no a esa obra de arte. En ese sentido, es semejante a utilizar una hermosa puesta de sol o una escena de montaña para ayudarte a orar.

Por otro lado, algunas personas dan un significado supersticioso a los artículos religiosos. Un ejemplo podría ser enterrar una estatua para ayudarte a vender tu casa. Si quieres pedirle un favor a Dios, sólo pídeselo. Es mucho más probable que Dios escuche una oración sincera que una acción supersticiosa.


La razón que Dios da para el primer mandamiento es que él es un Dios apasionado, que ha elegido a los israelitas para que sean su pueblo. Cuando castiga el pecado, permite que el efecto de nuestras malas decisiones nos haga daño a nosotros y a quienes nos rodean. Pero cuando nos arrepentimos y cambiamos de conducta, su amor es eterno.

Dios también enfatiza algunos mandamientos repitiéndolos. Nos dice que no robemos a los demás y que tampoco planeemos robarle a nuestro prójimo. Lo mismo ocurre con el adulterio, planearlo es tan malo como hacerlo. Tomar su nombre en vano originalmente significaba cometer perjurio después de jurar decir la verdad. Esto es semejante al octavo mandamiento sobre dar testimonio falso.

Jesús simplificó todos estos mandamientos cuando nos recuerda amar a Dios con todo el corazón y amar al prójimo como a uno mismo. Recordemos eso mientras nos alejamos del pecado para servir mejor a Dios durante la Cuaresma. Tom Schmidt

Third Sunday of Lent



As we are now well into Lent, we can take a look at what it means to turn away from sin and be faithful to the Gospel. A good place to start would be the Ten Commandments. The reading from Exodus presents us with one

of the first listings of the Commandments. In this passage, God explains some of the laws to show how serious they are. For the first one, God includes making images to be used for worship. Now you might jump to the conclusion that all the statues and crucifixes in our churches must be destroyed. Not so.

In the days of Moses, people of other cultures made images of their gods and declared that the image was the god, and so should be worshipped. The Lord wanted his people to remember that God cannot be limited to an image or idea. That is still true today. Our images and statues are meant to help us pray to God, not to that work of art. In that sense, they are no worse than using a beautiful sunset or mountain scene to help you pray.

On the other hand, some people give a superstitious meaning to religious articles. Burying a statue to help sell your house could be one example. If you want to ask for a favor from God, just ask Him. God is much more likely to listen to a sincere prayer than a superstitious action.

The reason God gives for the first commandment is that he is a passionate God, who has chosen the Israelites to be his people. When he punishes sin, he allows the effect of our bad choices to hurt us and those around us. But when we repent and change our ways, his love is everlasting.

God also emphasizes some commands by duplicating them. He tells us not to steal from others, and also not to plan to steal from our neighbor. The same with adultery: Planning it is just as bad as doing it. Taking his name in vain originally meant perjuring yourself after taking an oath to tell the truth. That is similar to the eighth commandment about false witness.

Jesus simplified all these commands when he reminds us to love God with all your heart and love your neighbor as yourself. Let's remember that as we turn away from sin to serving God better during Lent. Tom Schmidt

Refresh the Soul

The reading from Exodus of the giving of the commandments puts into context the absolute prohibition of killing human beings. Before he says, "Thou shalt not kill," God says "I, the Lord, am your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt."

In other words, his commands are given in the context of his relationship with us. He rescues us, he frees us, he makes a covenant with us, he shares his life with us. From these realities flow the commandments. He is not simply imposing something on us from the outside; rather, he is showing us what the new way of life entails. We obey

the commandments because we're God's children. We respect life not just because "God said so," but because God is life. We are to be truthful because God is truth. We are to be just because God is justice, and if we share in his life, we will act like him.

This is the positive context in which our people can understand the absolute command to respect, promote, and defend life. It is not a burdensome command; rather, as today's psalm tells us, it "refreshes the soul," because it shows the soul the way to happiness and fulfillment.

Our Lord's promise to raise up the temple of his body (today's Gospel passage) completes this whole context, because it is only through his resurrection that the life of God can be given to us. That risen life, of course, is what the catechumens are preparing all during Lent to receive. Moreover, each of us is preparing, through Lenten penance, to renew the promises of our baptism at Easter – the promises to follow the new way of life which the commandments reflect. ~ Priests for Life ~
