

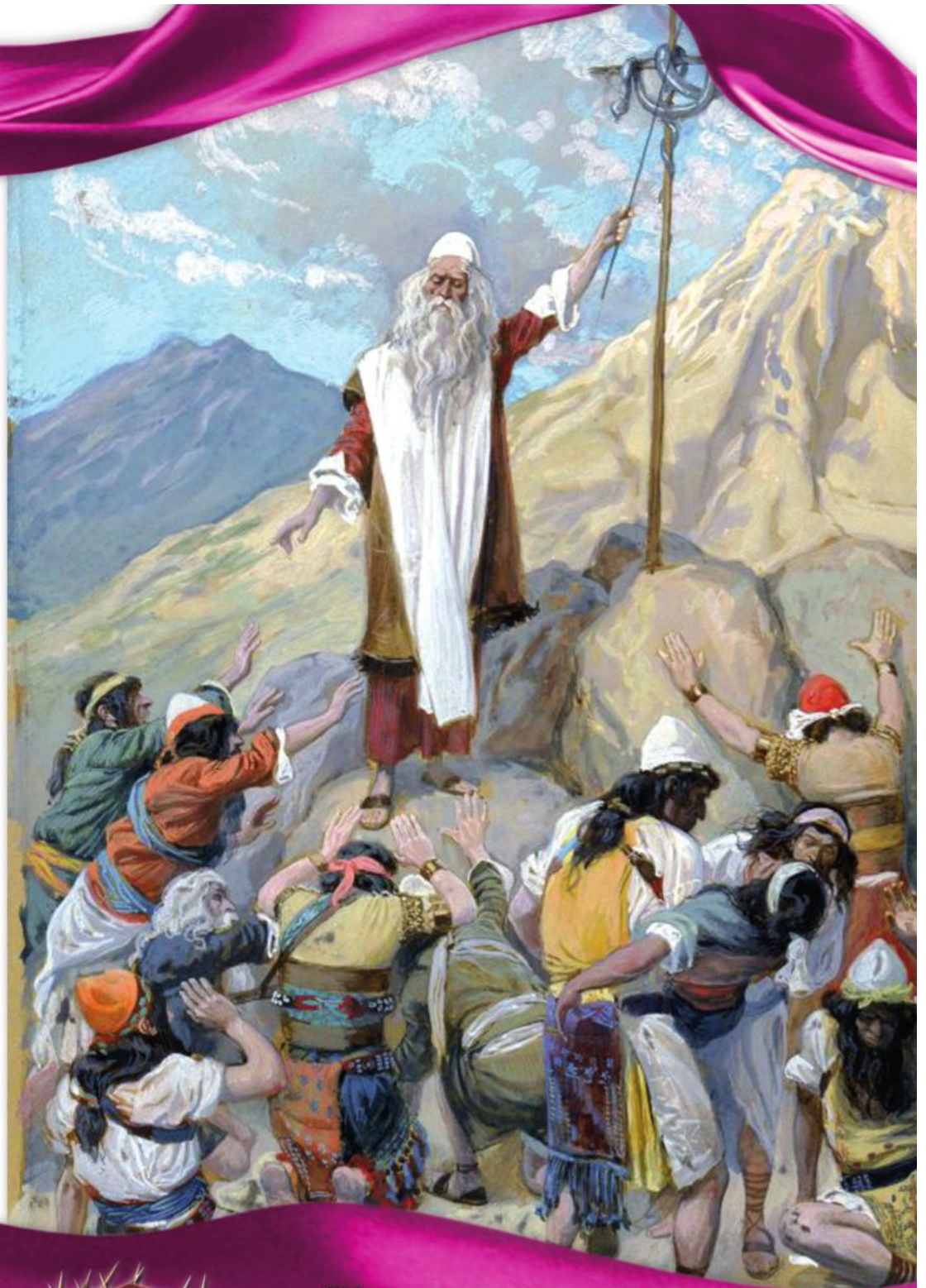

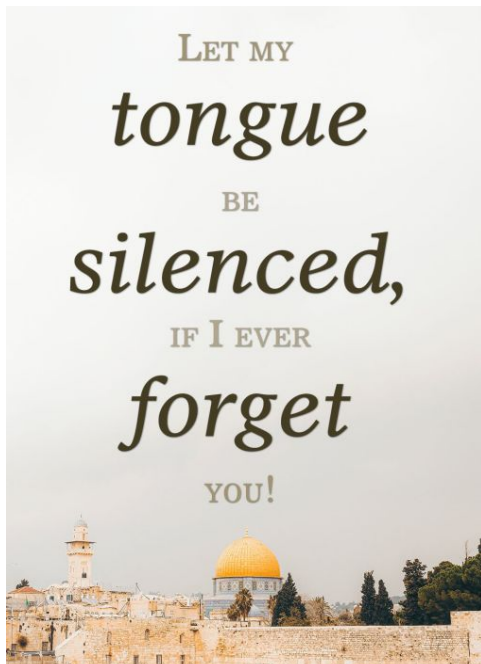

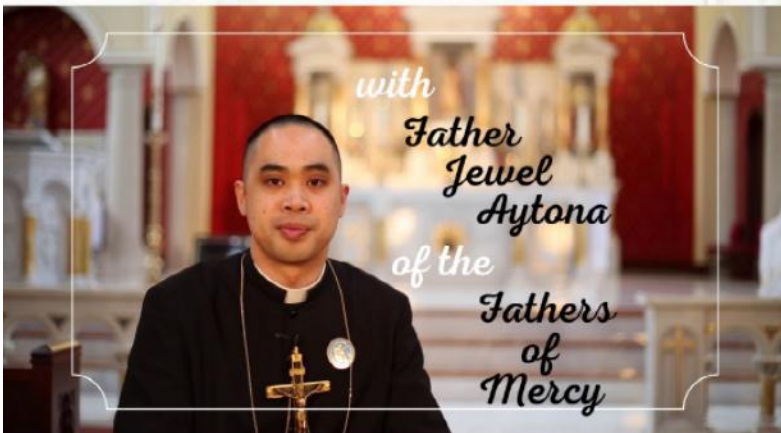

St. James Haiti Committee UPDATE 2024 Parish Twinning Program of the Americas'

For Our New Parishioners: The city of St. Marc is on the Eastern coast, approximately 60 miles north of Port Au Prince. Our twinning activity with St. Marc Parish has endured since 1991. Through the love compassion and generosity of our St. James Parishioners during these past years many basic needs have been met, a water purification system, bathrooms for the church, a large generator, renovations of both St. Marc Church and 18th century Rectory. We have lent support to a primary school, two Home Economics classes and helped build a Tech School which we continue to support. We have participated in Food for the Poor matching funds program to benefit the needy of St. Marc.

Other assistance of major importance are salaries for catechist who take the Word of God to the many chapels of St. Marc Parish. We helped provide a radio station where the rosary is said daily, and St. Marc Parish can stay in contact with those whom the clergy can only reach but once a month.

We were able to assist in the building of Barbe Chapel from a dirt floor & leaking tin roof structure to a decent place of worship and in the past years assisted in the building of one other chapel.

All Parishioners: We are eternally grateful for your monthly donations. Without them we could not continue to do God's work for our Haitian brothers and sisters, who are in dire need of our love and support as the current situation in Haiti remains grim. Gangs terrorize the roadways and communities with hold-ups, beatings and kidnappings compounding the peoples' daily struggle. We pray for the safety of the priests as they are often a target. Last year Father Venel Suffrard, Pastor of St. Marc Parish requested our financial help to repair the church roof, initial cost projected to be \$25,000.00 (note: the church is cathedral sized), the main leak is at the left side of the altar - not good. Funds for this project, along with funds for the Parish and Tech School are sent quarterly. We send what we can as donated. A significant balance remains.

Shipping to Port Au Prince / St. Marc Parish is still impossible due to gang activity. Therefore, our focus is on helping with the everyday monthly expenses of the Parish, the Tech School needs and projects such as the Church roof. Note: The donated food items, that were becoming outdated, and a few other items have been shared with our St. Vincent de Paul food pantry. All material & sewing items are being securely held for shipping. Contact Lois Shinkle 270-317-3277 with questions.

Our 2024 Lenten appeal is from February 14 to March. Donations can be made throughout the year by using the blue envelope provided by St. James Parish. Make checks payable to St. James Church, marked Haiti.

Banking: Our St. James Bookkeeper sees that all donated funds are safely transferred to St. Marc Parish via the Fonoze Banking system, which we have used successfully for many years.

Pastor of St. Marc Parish, Fr. Venel Suffrard, is an average size man, with a slim build and ready smile is dedicated to actively addressing the spiritual & material needs of the people God has entrusted to his care. Father is a man of both prayer and action. He prays asking God's blessings on his parishioners and the parishioners of St. James. Father repeatedly expresses his sincere appreciation and eternal gratitude for the love, compassion and generosity so unselfishly shown by the people of St. James. He is grateful for you and the difference your support makes in a country that has long struggled for the very basics of life, the things we take for granted. May God keep him safe and bless his endeavors, and may our love, compassion & generosity be such that it MAKES GOD SMILE!

Our brothers & sisters of St. Marc Parish are eternally grateful for the support we offer and continue to pray for us, as we also pray for them; mindful that all things begin and end with our Heavenly Father. May He shower Haiti with His mercy.

Cuarto domingo de Cuaresma ¿Decir, hacer o ser?



San Pablo nos dice en su carta a los Efesios que somos salvados a través de la gracia. Las acciones de Dios de enviar a su Hijo a morir por nosotros y resucitar a Jesús de entre los muertos muestran el amor que Dios tiene por nosotros. Proviene enteramente de Dios. Somos salvados por nuestra fe en

Jesús, pero incluso esa fe viene de Dios. Así que, cuando Pablo dice que nadie puede presumir sobre ser salvado, quiere decir que no podemos sumar las buenas obras como puntos de recompensa para el cielo. También quiere decir que no podemos presumir de nuestra fe porque podemos recitar el credo o irnos al altar cuando nos inviten. Entonces, si ser salvado no es cuestión de decir las cosas correctas o hacer buenas obras, ¿qué es?

La respuesta viene del evangelio. Jesús nos dice que será levantado, o crucificado, para que podamos creer en él y obtener la vida eterna. Ten en cuenta que no da una lista de hechos acerca de Dios que debemos creer. Cuando “creemos en” alguien, ponemos nuestro amor y confianza en esa persona.

Queremos estar con esa persona lo más posible. Sabemos que somos amados y por eso respondemos dando amor. Nuestra respuesta de amor no es sólo un sentimiento de felicidad. Nos inspira a dejar de ser egoístas y empezar a darnos cuenta de que los demás necesitan nuestra ayuda. Jesús lo describe como vivir en la luz: no nos avergonzamos de ayudar a alguien, perdonar a alguien o consolar a alguien. Si bien no imponemos nuestra fe a los demás, tampoco la ocultamos. Nuestra vida está en la luz, abierta a cualquiera que quiera ver lo que Dios ha hecho por nosotros.

Eso nos lleva de nuevo a la pregunta sobre la salvación: no es algo que hacemos o decimos. Es lo que Dios hace por nosotros. Nuestra respuesta de fe también es su don. Entonces, cuando reconocemos todo lo que Dios ha hecho por nosotros y creemos en su Hijo Jesús, el Espíritu nos guiará a vivir esa fe y compartirla con los demás. *Tom Schmidt*

PARISH LIFE

Fourth Sunday of Lent Saying, Doing, or Being?

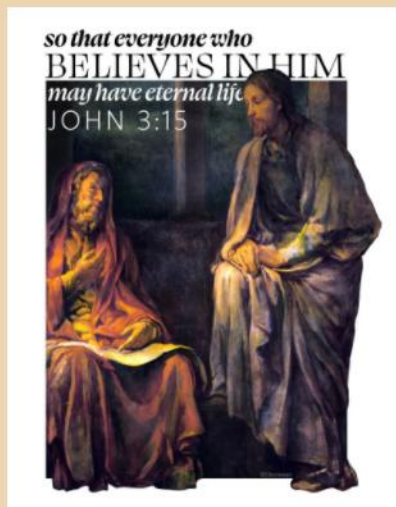
St. Paul tells us in his letter to the Ephesians that we are saved through grace: God's actions of sending his Son to die for us, and raising Jesus from the dead show the love God has for us. It comes entirely from God. We are saved by our faith in Jesus, but even that faith comes from God. So when Paul says that no one can boast about being saved, he means that we can't add up our good deeds like reward points for heaven. He also means that we can't brag about our faith because we can recite the creed or answer an altar call. So if being saved is not a matter of saying the right things, or doing good deeds, what is it?

The answer comes from the gospel. Jesus tells us that he will be lifted up, or crucified, so that we can believe in him and have eternal life. Notice he doesn't give a list of facts about God that we are required to believe.

When we "believe in" someone, we put our love and trust in that person. We want to be with that person as much as we can. We know that we are loved and so respond by giving love. Our response of love is not just a happy feeling. It inspires us to stop being selfish and start noticing that others need our help. Jesus describes it as living in the light: we are not ashamed to help someone, forgive someone, or comfort someone. While we do not force our faith on others, we don't hide it either. Our life is in the light, open to anyone who wants to see what God has done for us.

That brings us back to the question about salvation: it is not something we do or say. It is what God does for us. Our response of faith is also his gift. So when we recognize all that God has done for us and believe in his Son Jesus, the Spirit will guide us to live that faith and share it with others.

PARISH LIFE



The Most Basic Right

“The common outcry, which is justly made on behalf of human rights -- for example, the right to health, to home, to work, to family, to culture -- is false and illusory if the right to life, the most basic and fundamental right and the condition for all other personal rights, is not defended with maximum determination.”
--Pope John Paul II, *Christifideles Laici* (1988), n. 38.

The Gospel assigned for today brings us to the most well-known verse of the Bible, John 3:16 -- “God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, that everyone who believes in him might not perish, but have everlasting life.”

As Lent draws closer to its culmination in the Easter Triduum, it becomes clearer in the readings and prayers of the liturgy that this season is a great preparation for receiving the gift of eternal life obtained for us through the Lord’s Passion and Resurrection. The Catechumens of the Church prepare to receive this gift in baptism; the rest of us prepare for the renewal of our baptismal vows at Easter Mass; for all of us, it is the fulfillment of John 3:16.

...As The Gospel of Life makes clear, this promise of eternal life implies the sacrosanct character of natural life, which provides the foundation and context in which we accept this gift of everlasting life. His will is that human beings not perish – neither by losing their salvation, nor by being deprived of the opportunity to grasp it by being born and eventually hearing God’s word and living the faith. God always shows himself to be on the side of human life.

Yet the acceptance of life, natural and supernatural, and the defense of that life, creates division. “The light came into the world, but people preferred darkness to light.” This explains why we have to fight against the forces in our world that would destroy human life. He who would destroy it “does not come toward the light, so that his works might not be exposed.” Injustice in the world always flourishes when it is hidden. Those who support the culture of death in all its forms want to keep their actions hidden. the reality of abortion continues to lie hidden. People never see the procedure on television or in print. People who do see it are often converted on the spot.

The application for us is that our Lenten journey, and our acceptance of light and life (baptismal symbols) empower us to abandon denial and face both good and evil head-on with honesty, and with confidence in the ultimate triumph of grace over sin, truth over falsehood, and life over death. ~ *Priests for Life* ~

New Opportunity for Feedback to the Synod

The "Interim Stage" for the Synod on Synodality is the period between Synod of Bishops' meetings in October 2023 and October 2024.
