



St. James Haiti Committee UPDATE 2024 Parish Twinning Program of the Americas'

PARISH TWINNING PROGRAM OF THE AMERICAS For Our New Parishioners: The city of St. Marc is on the Eastern coast, approximately 60 miles north of Port Au Prince. Our twinning activity with St. Marc Parish

has endured since 1991. Through the love compassion and generosity of our St. James Parishioners during these past years many basic needs have been met, a water purification system, bathrooms for the church, a large generator, renovations of both St. Marc Church and 18th century Rectory. We have lent support to a primary school, two Home Economics classes and helped build a Tech School which we continue to support. We have participated in Food for the Poor matching funds program to benefit the needy of St. Marc.

Other assistance of major importance are salaries for catechist who take the Word of God to the many chapels of St. Marc Parish. We helped provide a radio station where the rosary is said daily, and St. Marc Parish can stay in contact with those whom the clergy can only reach but once a month.

We were able to assist in the building of Barbe Chapel from a dirt floor & leaking tin roof structure to a decent place of worship and in the past years assisted in the building of one other chapel.

All Parishioners: We are eternally grateful for your monthly donations. Without them we could not continue to do God's work for our Haitian brothers and sisters, who are in dire need of our love and support as the current situation in Haiti remains grim. Gangs terrorize the roadways and communities with hold-ups, beatings and kidnappings compounding the peoples' daily struggle. We pray for the safety of the priests as they are often a target. Last year Father Venel Suffrard, Pastor of St. Marc Parish requested our financial help to repair the church roof, initial cost projected to be \$25,000.00 (note: the church is cathedral sized), the main leak is at the left side of the altar - not good. Funds for this project, along with funds for the Parish and Tech School are sent quarterly. We send what we can as donated. A significant balance remains.

Shipping to Port Au Prince / St. Marc Parish is still impossible due to gang activity. Therefore, our focus is on helping with the everyday monthly expenses of the Parish, the Tech School needs and projects such as the Church roof. Note: The donated food items, that were becoming outdated, and a few other items have been shared with our St. Vincent de Paul food pantry. All material & sewing items are being securely held for shipping. Contact Lois Shinkle 270-317-3277 with questions.

Our 2024 Lenten appeal is from February 14 to March. Donations can be made throughout the year by using the blue envelope provided by St. James Parish. Make checks payable to St. James Church, marked Haiti.

Banking: Our St. James Bookkeeper sees that all donated funds are safely transferred to St. Marc Parish via the Fonoze Banking system, which we have used successfully for many years.

Pastor of St. Marc Parish, Fr. Venel Suffrard, is an average size man, with a slim build and ready smile is dedicated to actively addressing the spiritual & material needs of the people God has entrusted to his care. Father is a man of both prayer and action. He prays asking God's blessings on his parishioners and the parishioners of St. James. Father repeatedly expresses his sincere appreciation and eternal gratitude for the love, compassion and generosity so unselfishly shown by the people of St. James. He is grateful for you and the difference your support makes in a country that has long struggled for the very basics of life, the things we take for granted. May God keep him safe and bless his endeavors, and may our love, compassion & generosity be such that it MAKES GOD SMILE!

Our brothers & sisters of St. Marc Parish are eternally grateful for the support we offer and continue to pray for us, as we also pray for them; mindful that all things begin and end with our Heavenly Father. May He shower Haiti with His mercy.

Quinto domingo de Cuaresma Padre, perdónalos

La promesa hecha por el Señor en la primera lectura es muy audaz. Dice que todos lo conocerán, sin tener que ser enseñados por otros. No restringe la promesa sólo a las personas más santas. Dice que la manera en que las personas lo conocerán es a través del perdón de sus pecados. Acuérdate que está hablando a los israelitas, que tenían tantas leyes y mandamientos que necesitaban escribas y fariseos para seguirlos. Cuando rompían un mandamiento o una ley, quedaban aislados de la comunidad. Así que, la promesa de que Dios pondría su ley en sus corazones significaba que serían libres de hacer la voluntad de Dios porque quisieran, no porque temieran el castigo o el rechazo.

Jesús dice algo semejante en el evangelio de hoy. Les dice a los discípulos que su crucifixión atraería a todos hacia él. Ahora, la muerte de Jesús mostró que él asumió el castigo por los pecados en lugar nuestro, quienes lo merecemos. En el evangelio de Lucas incluso ora por quienes lo crucificaron, pidiendo el perdón a Dios. (Lc 23,34) Al morir en la cruz, Jesús muestra cuánto nos ama Dios. Al resucitar de entre los muertos, demuestra que podemos resucitar del pecado a una vida nueva de fe y amor.

Volviendo a la primera lectura, experimentamos esa promesa cuando presentamos nuestros pecados a Dios. Cuando perdonamos a las personas que nos han lastimado, también les ayudamos a experimentar ese amor. Después de todo, si yo puedo perdonar a alguien, seguramente Dios lo perdonará. También ayudamos a otros a conocer a Dios cuando compartimos o experimentamos el perdón. ¿Todavía no estás seguro si Dios te ha perdonado? El sacramento de la Reconciliación nos da la seguridad del perdón de Dios, y también la experiencia. Junto con los demás sacramentos, nos ayuda a mantener el amor de Dios en nuestros corazones. Fifth Sunday of Lent Father, Forgive Them

The promise made by the Lord in the first reading is very bold. He says that all people shall know him, without having to be taught by others. He doesn't restrict the promise to only the holiest people: He says that the way people will know Him is through forgiveness of their sins. Remember, he is speaking to the Israelites, who had so many laws and commandments, they needed scribes and Pharisees to keep track of them. When they broke a commandment or law, they were isolated from the community. So the promise that God would place his law in their hearts meant they would be free to do God's will because they want to, not because they were feared punishment or rejection.

Jesus says something similar in today's gospel. He tells the disciples that his crucifixion would draw everyone to him. Now, Jesus' death showed that he took on the punishment for sins in place of us, who deserve it. In Luke's gospel he even prays for those who crucified him, asking God's forgiveness. (Lk 23:34) By dying on the cross, Jesus shows how much God loves us. By rising from the dead, he shows that we can rise from sin to a new life of faith and love.

Getting back to the first reading, we experience that promise when we bring our sins to God. When we forgive people who have hurt us, we also help them to experience that love. After all, if I can forgive someone, surely God will forgive them. We also help others to know God when we share or experience of being forgiven. Still not sure if God has forgiven you? The sacrament of Reconciliation gives us the assurance of God's forgiveness, as well as the experience. Along with the other sacraments, it helps us keep God's love in our hearts. Wisdom of the Ages

Tertullian, a Christian writer who died in the third century, wrote the following: 'Thus, you read the word of God, spoken to Jeremias: "Before I formed thee in the womb, I knew thee." If God forms us in the womb, He also breathes on us as He did in the beginning: "And God formed man and breathed into him the breath of life." Nor could God have known man in the womb unless he were a whole man. "And before thou camest forth from the womb, I sanctified thee." Was it, then, a dead body at that stage? Surely it was not, for "God is the God of the living and not the dead."'- De Anima 26.5

The Gospel of Christ is the Gospel of Life, precisely because when the "grain of wheat falls to the earth and dies, it produces much fruit." The paradox of the Gospel of Life is that life is poured out on the world precisely when life is given away for the good of others. In Evangelium Vitae we read:

"He who had come "not to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many" (Mk 10:45), attains on the Cross the heights of love: "Greater love has no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends" (Jn 15:13). And he died for us while we were yet sinners (cf. Rom 5:8). "In this way Jesus proclaims that life finds its centre, its meaning and its fulfillment when it is given up. "At this point our meditation becomes praise and thanksgiving, and at the same time urges us to imitate Christ and follow in his footsteps (cf. 1 Pt 2:21). "We too are called to give our lives for our brothers and sisters, and thus to realize in the fullness of truth the meaning and destiny of our existence" (EV #51).

Christ is the grain of wheat that falls to the earth, but is also "lifted up from the earth" – both on the cross and in the Resurrection and Ascension. And the fruit is that he "draws all people to himself."

We have here the powerful themes of life-giving fruitfulness and unity. The Culture of Death denies both. It embraces, through "pro-choice" rhetoric, the "loving of one's own life" that Christ rejects in this Gospel teaching. The words "This is my body" are used with opposite meanings: "I control my life" or "I give my life."

As we approach Holy Week and meditate on the Passion, it is a perfect time to call our people to a renewed commitment to give themselves away to defend the vulnerable, particularly the most oppressed, who are the unborn. ~ Priests for Life ~






