# Domingo de Pascua Un buen dia para morir



¿Recuerdas tu propio bautismo? Yo quisiera poderme acordar. Fui bautizado como bebé, con apenas unos días de edad. Envidio a los adultos que he visto bautizados en la Vigilia Pascual. Ojalá experimenten lo que dice San Pablo en la epístola que escuchamos en la Vigilia. Para

Pablo, el bautismo es signo de morir y resucitar a una vida nueva. Me suena como la Pascua. Después de morir, Jesús resucitó de entre los muertos. ¿Pablo nos está diciendo que nosotros también resucitaremos de entre los muertos?

Sí, pero no es su punto principal. Si solamente pensamos en la muerte física y esperamos ir al cielo después, no estamos entendiendo el punto. La vida nueva comienza con el bautismo, no sólo con la muerte física. Es por eso que Pablo dice cosas como "el viejo yo fue crucificado" o "el cuerpo pecaminoso fue eliminado..." (Romanos 6,6). El bautismo nos da una nueva vida AHORA. El agua es a la vez limpiadora y una señal de muerte (ahogamiento simbólico) que nos ayuda a ver que quedamos libres del pecado. Estamos muertos al pecado cuando comenzamos a vivir en Cristo. Los klingon ficticios tienen un dicho "hoy es un buen día para morir" para expresar valor en la batalla. Pero los verdaderos cristianos podrían decir que la Pascua es un buen día para morir. Hemos muerto al pecado y hemos comenzado una nueva vida en Cristo.

¿Cómo experimentamos esta muerte al pecado? Primero, identificamos las áreas pecaminosas de nuestra vida. ¿Veo películas, videojuegos o programas de televisión que fomentan la promiscuidad, la mentira, la venganza, el odio o el egoísmo? ¿Cuales pecados confieso repetidamente y qué puedo hacer para evitarlos?

Luego buscamos formas de actuar diferente: ¿Puedo pasar más tiempo con amigos/familiares que sean ejemplos de amor? ¿Puedo dedicar menos tiempo a la diversión y más a la oración? En lugar de quejarme de lo que está mal en el mundo, ¿puedo encontrar formas de mejorarlo? (Si no el mundo, entonces mi comunidad o mi familia). Estas son algunas de las formas en que comenzamos a tener una vida nueva en Cristo. Tom Schmidt

# **Easter Sunday** A Good Day to Die


Do you remember your own baptism? I wish I could; I was baptized as an infant, just a few days old. I envy the adults I have seen baptized at the Easter Vigil. Hopefully, they experience what St. Paul says in the epistle we hear at the Vigil. For Paul, Baptism is a sign of dying and rising to new life. Sounds like Easter to me. So when Jesus died, he rose from the dead. Is Paul telling us that we will rise from the dead, too?

Yes, but that is not his main point. If all we think about is our physical death, and hope we go to heaven afterwards, we're missing the point. The new life starts with our baptism, not just our physical death. That's why Paul says things like, "our old self was crucified" or "sinful body done away with...." (Rom 6:6) Baptism gives us a new life NOW. The water is both cleansing and a sign of dying (symbolic drowning) that help us see we are free from sin. We are dead to sin when we begin to live in Christ. The fictional Klingons have a saying "today is a good day to die" to express courage in battle. But real Christians might say that Easter is a good day to die: we have died to sin and begun a new life in Christ.

How do we experience this dying to sin? First, we identify the sinful areas of our life. Do I watch movies, video games, or TV shows that encourage promiscuity, lying, revenge, hatred or selfishness? What sins do I confess repeatedly and what can I do to avoid them?

Next we look for ways to act differently: Can I spend more time with friends/relatives who are examples of love? Can I spend less time entertaining myself and more time in prayer? Instead of complaining about what is wrong with the world, can I find ways to make

it better? (If not the world, then my community or family.) These are a few of the ways we begin our new life in Christ. Tom Schmidt





# **SOCIAL CONCERNS**





"Have no fear. The outcome of the battle for life is already decided, even though the struggle goes on against great odds and with much suffering... The paradox of the Christian message is this: Christ - the head - has already conquered sin and death. Christ in his body - the pilgrim people of God - continually suffers the onslaught of the Evil One and all the evil which sinful humanity is capable of.

And the mission of proclaiming it to the ends of the earth is now passing to your generation...The church needs your energies, your enthusiasm, your youthful ideals, in order to make the Gospel of life penetrate the fabric of society, transforming people's hearts and the structures of society in order to create a civilization of true justice and love."

Easter makes it clear that being "pro-life" is not something that flows primarily from any political or ideological loyalty, nor simply from a cause, plan, project, or organization. Being pro-life, and all its other manifestations and activities, flow from what happened on Easter. Christ did not only conquer his death; he overturned the entire kingdom of death!

On Easter, we do not come to Church simply to congratulate Jesus for rising from the dead. We come to celebrate the fact that we share that victory. We too, by living and dying in him, will rise in him on the last day.

But this victory is also about today, because we share his risen life now. If we share his life, we are "an Easter people," or as Evangelium Vitae says, "the People of Life." This means that we proclaim this victory of life, and stand strongly against all the forces in our society that eclipse or destroy the value of life – foremost among them all being abortion. We stand before these forces, not intimidated, hesitant, or unsure of our ability to overcome them. Instead, we stand before them in strength, declaring that they no longer have any ground to stand on, nor any place in our midst. Christ is Risen!


