SOCIAL CONCERNS



We all fall short in various ways, but there is a great difference between struggling to live according to the teachings of the Church and rejecting those teachings. - Before I Formed You in the Womb I Knew You, A Pastoral Letter on the Human Dignity of the Unborn, Holy Communion, and Catholics in Public Life by the Most Reverend Salvatore Joseph Cordileone, Archbishop of San Francisco, May 2021. The Lord's words in the Gospel passage for today speak about what Easter has accomplished: a new human community, that takes birth from the Spirit and is filled with the very life of the Risen Christ. We all descended from Adam on a natural level; we all are built into Christ on the supernatural level. He is the new Adam, and Easter began the new humanity, victorious over the grave and sharing the life that lasts forever.

This supernatural community, symbolized by vine and branches, obviously builds on the natural community. To enjoy supernatural life, we must have natural life, and to appreciate the meaning of

supernatural community, we must have some appreciation of natural community. In our day, however, the very notion of "community" even on a natural level has been obscured by false notions of freedom that separate everyone into his or her own sphere of "choices" and purely personal evaluations of what is true and right. The fruit of this freedom disconnected from truth is the Culture of Death, in which people think that they have responsibility only to those for whom they choose to take responsibility.

In the natural and supernatural community established by God, however, we have responsibility before we choose. God (not we) has chosen the other branches on the vine, the other members of the community. We must welcome them all, although, as the First Reading demonstrates, it can be challenging to overcome our prejudices.

But here is where the "fruit" comes in. The Lord says we must "bear fruit." What is this fruit? It is the fruit of love, concretely visible in a life of self-giving, as the commandments specify (Second Reading). The fruit that is to be visible in the community is that we welcome and serve all – born and unborn, healthy and sick, convenient and inconvenient. We can't do it on our own power. That's why we have to stay united to the vine. It is the power of His love in us that makes it possible for us to love as he has commanded, with the very same love that led Christ to the cross and to the glory of the Resurrection. ~ *Priests for Life* ~

Quinto Domingo de Pascua ¿Vivir avergonzado?

En la lectura de la primera carta de San Juan, habla de que nuestra conciencia nos reprocha. (1 Juan 3,20) Se refiere a la vergüenza que sentimos cuando hacemos algo pecaminoso. Cuando dice que Dios es más grande que nuestra conciencia, quiere decir que incluso cuando sabemos que hemos pecado, incluso si nos sentimos indignos de ser perdonados, Dios sigue siendo un Dios que perdona, que no espera que seamos "dignos". Él espera pacientemente que le pidamos su misericordia, que queramos su perdón. Entonces, cuando confesamos nuestros pecados, no debemos dudar de que somos perdonados.

Pero a veces sentimos vergüenza cuando no hemos hecho nada malo. Puede ser algo sencillo, como estornudar durante un momento de silencio en la sinfonía. O puede ser algo más serio, como cuando lastimas a alguien por equivocación. En estos momentos es bueno recordar que Dios sabe lo que pasó y todavía nos ama.

La mejor manera de recordar esto es vivir como Dios manda, amando a Dios y al prójimo. Si crees en Jesús, amas a Dios porque confías en que Dios envió a su Hijo para salvarnos. Entonces sabemos que Dios nos perdona incluso antes de que se lo pidamos. Si amas a tu prójimo, entonces te acercas a la persona que has lastimado, en lugar de esconderte avergonzado, e intentas ayudarla.

Cuando dejamos de vivir avergonzados y comenzamos a vivir en el amor, sabemos que el Señor vive en nosotros. Y como señalan tanto la segunda lectura como el evangelio, podemos pedir lo que necesitemos y recibirlo. Porque cuando Dios vive en nosotros y nosotros vivimos en él, no vamos a pedir nada trivial o egoísta. Su Espíritu nos enseña cómo orar con confianza y fe. Oramos como Jesús enseñó en el Padrenuestro: "Hágase tu voluntad". Nuestro amor y confianza en Dios nos ayudarán a aceptar cualquier cosa que Dios nos mande en el camino. *Tom Schmidt*

Fifth Sunday of Easter Living in Shame?

In the reading from St. John's first letter, he talks about our hearts condemning us. (1 John 3:20) He is referring to the shame we feel when we do something sinful. When he says God is greater than our hearts he means that even when we know we have sinned, even if we feel unworthy to be forgiven, God is still a forgiving God, who doesn't wait for us to be "worthy." He patiently waits for us to ask for his mercy, to want his forgiveness. So when we confess our sins, we need not doubt that we are forgiven.

But sometimes we feel shame when we have done nothing wrong. It may be something simple, like sneezing in the quiet part of a symphony. Or perhaps something more serious, such as when you accidentally hurt someone. That is when it is good to remember that God knows what happened and still loves us.

The best way to remember this is by living as God commands, by loving God and our neighbor. If you believe in Jesus, you love God, because you trust that God sent his Son to save us. So we know that God forgives us even before we ask him to. If you love your neighbor, then you reach out to the person you hurt, instead of hiding in shame, and try to help them.

When we stop living in shame and start living in love, we know that the Lord lives in us. And as both the second reading and the gospel point out, we can ask for whatever we need and receive it. For when God lives in us and we live in him, we won't ask for anything trivial or selfish. His Spirit teaches us how to pray with confidence and faith. We pray as Jesus taught in the Lord's Prayer: "Thy will be done." Our love and trust in God will help us to accept whatever God sends our way. *Tom Schmidt*
